**IMPACT:** State

**Summary of Legislation:** The bill creates the Land Use Task Force to study and make recommendations concerning: (1) areas where food insecurity exists; (2) development growth trends in rural, suburban, and urban communities across Indiana; and (3) other community growth issues.

**Effective Date:** Upon passage.

**Explanation of State Expenditures:** The bill establishes a 13-member task force composed of 3 members from the Senate, 3 members from the House of Representatives, and 7 lay members. The bill would allow each legislative and lay member to receive the same per diem, mileage, and travel allowances as members of an interim study committee established by the Legislative Council. Under the most recent Legislative Council resolution, the interim budget is \$13,500 for interim study committees consisting of 15 or fewer members

It is likely the Legislative Services Agency (LSA) would be able to assume the responsibilities of staffing the proposed task force with existing staff. The LSA has two GIS qualified staff members in the Office of Census Data that could be utilized if needed.
