



## **ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1201**

DIGEST OF HB 1201 (Updated April 12, 2023 9:30 am - DI 140)

Citations Affected: IC 16-18; IC 16-46.

**Synopsis:** Rare disease advisory council. Establishes the rare disease advisory council (council) to address various issues concerning the needs of patients in Indiana with rare diseases and their caregivers and providers. Establishes duties and procedures of the council. Requires the Indiana department of health to provide administrative assistance to and pay the administrative expenses of the council.

Effective: July 1, 2023.

# ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1201

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning health.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 16-18-2-84, AS AMENDED BY P.L.141-2014,
2	SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2023]: Sec. 84. (a) "Council", for purposes of IC 16-46-6,
4	refers to the interagency state council on black and minority health.
5	(b) "Council", for purposes of IC 16-46-17, refers to the rare
6	disease advisory council.
7	SECTION 2. IC 16-46-17 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
8	AS A <b>NEW</b> CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
9	JULY 1, 2023]:
10	Chapter 17. Rare Disease Advisory Council
11	Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "council" refers to the rare
12	disease advisory council established by section 2 of this chapter.
13	Sec. 2. The rare disease advisory council is established.
14	Sec. 3. The duties of the council include the following:
15	(1) Conduct public meetings to survey the needs of patients in
16	Indiana with rare diseases and their caregivers and providers.
17	(2) Provide testimony, comments, and recommendations



1	concerning legislation and rules that impact the patients in
2	Indiana with rare diseases.
3	(3) After consulting with experts on rare diseases, develop
4	policy recommendations to improve patient access to and the
5	quality of:
6	(A) rare disease specialists;
7	(B) affordable and comprehensive health care coverage;
8	(C) relevant diagnostics;
9	(D) timely treatment; and
10	(E) other needed services for patients with rare diseases.
1	(4) Research and make recommendations to state agencies
12	and insurers that provide services to persons with rare
13	diseases on the impact of prior authorization, cost sharing
14	tiering, or other utilization management procedures on the
15	provision of treatment and care for patients.
16	(5) Evaluate and make recommendations to improve
17	Medicaid coverage of drugs for patients with rare diseases to
18	improve coverage of diagnostics, and facilitate access to
19	necessary health care providers with expertise in the
20	treatment of rare diseases.
21	(6) Publish a list of existing, publicly accessible resources or
22	research, diagnosis, treatment, and education relating to rare
23 24	diseases on the state department's website.
24	(7) Evaluate the current status and funding of pediatric
25	cancer research taking place in Indiana and how the research
26	interacts with the landscape of pediatric cancer research done
27	nationally.
28	(8) Study other issues and provide grants that impact patients
29	with rare diseases.
30	Sec. 4. (a) Beginning July 1, 2026, a chairperson shall be elected
31	by the council members at the first meeting after July 1 every
32	even-numbered year. If a vacancy occurs in the position of a
33	member who is the chairperson, the council shall elect a member
34	to serve the remainder of the chairperson's term at the next
35	meeting of the council.
36	(b) The chairperson may not be a state employee.
37	(c) Before August 1, 2023, the governor shall appoint the
38	chairperson of the council.
39	(d) The chairperson must meet one (1) of the qualifications of a
10	member under section 5(b) of this chapter. This subsection expires

8	(b) Before September 1, 2023, the governor shall appoint the
9	following voting members:
10	(1) A representative from a research university in Indiana
11	that receives grant funding for rare disease research.
12	(2) A registered nurse or advanced practice registered nurse
13	licensed under IC 25-23 with experience treating rare
14	diseases.
15	(3) A physician licensed under IC 25-22.5 with experience
16	treating rare diseases.
17	(4) A hospital administrator from a hospital licensed under
18	IC 16-21 that provides care to individuals diagnosed with a
19	rare disease.
20	(5) Two (2) patients who have a rare disease.
21	(6) A caregiver of an individual with a rare disease.
22	(7) A representative of a rare disease patient organization that
23	operates in Indiana.
24	(8) A pharmacist with experience dispensing drugs used to
25	treat rare diseases.
26	(9) A representative of the biopharmaceutical industry.
27	(10) A representative of a health carrier as defined by
28	IC 27-1-46-3.
29	(11) A member of the scientific community who is engaged in
30	rare disease research, which may include a medical
31	researcher with experience conducting research on rare
32	diseases.
33	Sec. 6. (a) The term of a member appointed to the council is four
34	(4) years.
35	(b) Terms for appointed members begin on July 1 and end on
36	June 30 of an odd-numbered year.
37	(c) An appointed member may not serve more than one (1)
38	complete term.
39	(d) Notwithstanding subsection (a), the initial terms of the
40	appointed members of the council under section 5 of this chapter
41	are as follows:

(1) Members appointed under section 5(b)(1), 5(b)(4), 5(b)(7),

1	and 5(b)(10) of this chapter, for a term of two (2) years.
2	(2) Members appointed under section $5(b)(2)$ , $5(b)(5)$ , $5(b)(8)$ ,
3	and 5(b)(11) of this chapter, for a term of three (3) years.
4	(3) Members appointed under section 5(b)(3), 5(b)(6), and
5	5(b)(9) of this chapter, for a term of four (4) years.
6	Sec. 7. A member of the council may be removed by the
7	governor for cause.
8	Sec. 8. If a vacancy occurs on the council, the governor shall
9	appoint a qualified individual to serve the remainder of the term
10	within sixty (60) days of receiving notice of the vacancy.
11	Sec. 9. (a) The council must conduct a meeting before October
12	1, 2023. The initial meeting must be held on a date selected by a
13	majority of the members of the council. The chairperson shall call
14	all subsequent meetings.
15	(b) Between September 1, 2023, and September 1, 2024, the
16	council must meet not less than monthly.
17	(c) After September 1, 2024, the council must meet not less than
18	quarterly.
19	(d) Any meeting of the council that uses electronic
20	communications must comply with the requirements under
21	IC 5-14-1.5.
22	Sec. 10. Eight (8) members of the council constitute a quorum.
23	The affirmative vote of a majority of the quorum is required for
24	the council to take any action.
25	Sec. 11. (a) Each member of the council who is not a state
26	employee is entitled to receive both of the following:
27	(1) The minimum salary per diem provided by
28	IC 4-10-11-2.1(b).
29	(2) Reimbursement for travel expenses and other expenses
30	actually incurred in connection with the member's duties, as
31	provided in the state travel policies and procedures
32	established by the Indiana department of administration and
33	approved by the budget agency.
34	(b) Each member of the council who is a state employee is
35	entitled to reimbursement for travel expenses and other expenses
36	actually incurred in connection with the member's duties, as
37	provided in the state travel policies and procedures established by
38	the Indiana department of administration and approved by the
39	budget agency.
40	Sec. 12. The state department shall provide administrative
41	assistance to and pay the administrative expenses of the council.
42	Sec. 13. (a) Beginning January 1, 2024, the council shall submit



1	an annual report to the governor and the legislative council not
2	later than June 15. The report submitted to the legislative council
3	must be in an electronic format under IC 5-14-6.
4	(b) The report required in subsection (a) must include the
5	following:
6	(1) A summary of the council's activities and progress.
7	(2) Recommendations of the council to the governor and the
8	general assembly on ways to address the needs of people living
9	with rare diseases.
