HOUSE BILL No. 1216

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 21-18-18; IC 25-1-5-12.

Synopsis: Funding for the development of health professions. Establishes the linking industry to nursing education fund (fund) for the purpose of expanding nursing education opportunities. Defines terms and provides administrative provisions for the fund. Requires the commission for higher education (commission), before August 1, 2023, to develop an application for a competitive grant program that matches contributions from a health care entity to an educational institution on a dollar for dollar basis from the fund. Provides that the application may be submitted by any educational institution and must require the educational institution to include the expected number of additional students the educational institution will be able to accept into its nursing education program as a result of the matching program. Requires the commission to approve an application if sufficient funds are available and if the matching grant will be used by the educational institution for certain purposes. Provides that a partial grant may be awarded. Requires the commission to make an annual report of certain information to the legislative council. Provides that a matching grant may not be used for the construction of a new building or the renovation of an existing building. Requires the professional licensing agency to retain 80% of all fees collected from new and renewed board licenses and certificates unless a certain amount or percentage of the fee is designated for a specific fund. Requires the agency to use the amount retained to carry out the agency's purposes and to work toward the goal of issuing all new licenses and certificates within 30 days after a complete application is submitted. Appropriates from the state general fund to the commission for higher education \$30,000,000 for the state fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 2024, and \$30,000,000 for the state fiscal year beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025, to be used for the fund.

HOUSE BILL No. 1216

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning higher education and to make an appropriation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

11	program subject to approval by the board under

13	(d) "Fund" refers to the linking industry to nursing education

The linking industry to nursing education fund is 16 established for the purpose of expanding nursing education 17 opportunities. 18 Sec. 3. The commission shall administer the fund. 19 Sec. 4. The fund consists of appropriations from the general 20 assembly, gifts, bequests, and other sources of funding. 21 Sec. 5. Money in the fund at the end of a state fiscal year does 22 not revert to the state general fund. 23 Sec. 6. Money in the fund is continuously appropriated for the 24 purposes of this chapter. 25 Sec. 7. The expenses of administering the fund shall be paid 26 from money in the fund. 27 Sec. 8. The treasurer of state shall invest the money in the fund 28 not currently needed to meet the obligations of the fund in the same 29 manner as other public funds may be invested. 30 Sec. 9. Interest that accrues from investments of the fund shall 31 be deposited in the fund. 32 Sec. 10. (a) Before August 1, 2023, the commission shall develop 33 an application for a competitive grant program that matches 34 contributions from a health care entity to an educational institution 35 on a dollar for dollar basis from the fund. 36 (b) The application described in subsection (a) may be 37 submitted by any educational institution and must require the 38 educational institution to include the expected number of 39 additional students the educational institution will be able to accept 40 into its nursing education program as a result of the matching 41 grant under this section.

(c) The commission shall approve an application under this

22	report to the legislative council in an electronic format under

26	(2) The number of educational institutions approved for a
27	matching grant from the fund in the most recent fiscal year.
28	(3) The dollar amount of matching grants approved from the
29	fund in the most recent fiscal year.
30	(4) The balance in the fund as of June 30 of each year.
31	(5) The expected number of additional students the
32	educational institutions will be able to accept into their
33	nursing education programs as a result of the matching grants

35	SECTION 2. IC 25-1-5-12 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
36	AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
37	1, 2023]: Sec. 12. (a) Beginning July 1, 2023, the agency shall retain
38	eighty percent (80%) of all fees collected from:
39	(1) new licenses and certificates that are issued; and
40	(2) licenses and certificates that are renewed;
41	by each board, unless a certain amount or percentage of the fee is
42	designated for a specific fund.



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1 (b) The amount retained under subsection (a) shall remain with 2 the agency at the end of each state fiscal year and does not revert 3 to the state general fund. 4 (c) The agency shall use the amount retained under subsection 5 (a) to: 6 (1) carry out the purposes of this chapter; and 7 (2) work toward the goal of issuing all new licenses and 8 certificates within thirty (30) days after a complete 9 application is submitted. 10 SECTION 3. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2023] (a) There is appropriated from the state general fund to the commission for 11 12 higher education thirty million dollars (\$30,000,000) to be used for 13 the linking industry to nursing education fund under IC 21-18-18 14 for the state fiscal year beginning July 1, 2023, and ending June 30, 15 2024. 16 (b) There is appropriated from the state general fund to the 17 commission for higher education thirty million dollars 18 (\$30,000,000) to be used for the linking industry to nursing 19 education fund under IC 21-18-18 for the state fiscal year 20 beginning July 1, 2024, and ending June 30, 2025. 21 (c) This SECTION expires July 1, 2025.
