DIGEST OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Grant uses. Makes changes to the permitted uses of the Indiana border safety grants.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning public safety and to make an appropriation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 5-2-25 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS
2	A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3	1, 2023]:
4	Chanter 25, Indiana Border Safety Grant Program and Fund

Chapter 25. Indiana Border Safety Grant Program and Fund Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "fund" refers to the Indiana border safety grant fund established by section 5 of this chapter.

Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "institute" refers to the Indiana criminal justice institute established by IC 5-2-6-3.

- Sec. 3. As used in this chapter, "program" refers to the Indiana border safety grant program established by section 6 of this chapter.
- Sec. 4. As used in this chapter, "qualified law enforcement agency" means a law enforcement agency (as defined in IC 35-47-15-2):
 - (1) that is located in Indiana; and
 - (2) whose jurisdiction includes:
 - (A) an area located within ten (10) miles of the Indiana border with state of Illinois; or
- (B) an interchange:
 - (i) of an interstate highway connecting Indiana with the state of Illinois; and

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1	(ii) that is located within twenty-five (25) miles of	
2	the border of the state of Illinois.	
3	Sec. 5. (a) The Indiana border safety grant fund is established	
4	for the purpose of providing grants under section 6 of this chapter.	
5	The fund shall be administered by the institute.	
6	(b) The fund consists of the following:	
7	(1) Appropriations from the general assembly.	
8	(2) Donations to the fund from public or private sources.	
9	(3) Interest and dividends on assets of the fund.	
0	(4) Money transferred to the fund from other funds.	
1	(c) The treasurer of state shall invest the money in the fund not	
2	currently needed to meet the obligations of the fund in the same	
3	manner as other public funds may be invested. Interest that	
4	accrues from these investments shall be deposited in the fund.	
.5	(d) Money in the fund at the end of a state fiscal year does not	
6	revert to the state general fund.	
7	Sec. 6. (a) The Indiana border safety grant program is	
.8	established. The institute shall administer the program. The	
9	institute may award grants under this chapter to qualified law

31	(b) In order to obtain a grant under this chapter, a qualified	
32	law enforcement agency must apply for a grant from the institute	
3	in a manner prescribed by the institute. The institute shall evaluate	
34	the request and may award a grant if the qualified law	
35	enforcement agency demonstrates a need for the grant. The	
36	institute may prioritize grants to qualified law enforcement	
37	agencies where the grants will be most effectively utilized or based

9	SECTION 2. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2023] (a) There is	
10	appropriated to the Indiana border safety grant fund established	
1	by IC 5-2-25-5, as added by this act:

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ending before July 1, 2024, five million dollars ($5,000,000);
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              (2) for the state fiscal year beginning after June 30, 2024, and
              ending before July 1, 2025, five million dollars ($5,000,000);
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        from the state general fund for use by the Indiana criminal justice
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        institute in carrying out the purpose of the Indiana border safety
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        grant fund.
