DIGEST OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Alternative teacher certifications. Provides that the total annual amount of scholarships awarded from the next generation Hoosier educators scholarship fund to individuals enrolled in an alternative teacher certification program may not exceed \$1,000,000.

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A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning higher education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

accredited postsecondary educational institution after June 30, 2017,
may qualify for a scholarship under this chapter. section. To qualify for
a scholarship, an applicant must:

- (1) apply for a scholarship on a form supplied by the commission;
- (2) except as provided in subsection (b), have graduated from an Indiana nonaccredited nonpublic or state accredited high school accredited under IC 20-31-4.1 and:
 - (A) graduated in the highest twenty percent (20%) of students in the applicant's high school graduating class;
 - (B) received a score in the top twentieth percentile on the SAT or ACT examination; or
 - (C) achieved a cumulative grade point average upon graduation of at least 3.5 on a 4.0 grading scale (or its equivalent if another grading scale is used) for courses taken during grades 9, 10, 11, and 12;
