HOUSE BILL No. 1528

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning higher education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 21-12-16-5, AS AMENDED BY P.L.63-2021, SECTION 2, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2023]: Sec. 5. (a) An applicant who is enrolled in an accredited postsecondary educational institution after June 30, 2017, may qualify for a scholarship under this chapter. section. To qualify for a scholarship, an applicant must:

- (1) apply for a scholarship on a form supplied by the commission;
- (2) except as provided in subsection (b), have graduated from an Indiana nonaccredited nonpublic or state accredited high school accredited under IC 20-31-4.1 and:
 - (A) graduated in the highest twenty percent (20%) of students in the applicant's high school graduating class;
 - (B) received a score in the top twentieth percentile on the SAT or ACT examination; or
 - (C) achieved a cumulative grade point average upon graduation of at least 3.5 on a 4.0 grading scale (or its
