DIGEST

Collaborative agreement. Sets forth requirements of the standing order for a pharmacist prescribing a hormonal contraceptive patch or self-administered hormonal contraceptive. Requires a pharmacist who prescribes a hormonal contraceptive patch or self-administered hormonal contraceptive to operate under a collaborative agreement with a physician. Provides an exemption. Sets forth requirements of the collaborative agreement. Requires the board of pharmacy to consult with the medical licensing board of Indiana in adopting rules. Prohibits the rules from conflicting with a standing order.

15	Page 2, line 31, delete "to" and insert "if the following conditions
16	are met:
17	(1) At least one (1) of the following is met:
18	(A) The pharmacist has entered into and is operating in
19	accordance with a collaborative agreement with a
20	physician that meets the requirements set forth in
21	subsection (b).
22	(B) The pharmacist is prescribing and dispensing a similar
23	hormonal contraceptive patch or a self-administered
24	hormonal contraceptive to a patient who has been issued

1	a prescription for the hormonal contraceptive patch or
2	self-administered hormonal contraceptive in the previous
3	two (2) years by a physician licensed under IC 25-22.5.
4	(2) The pharmacist is prescribing and dispensing the
5	hormonal contraceptive patch or self-administered hormonal
6	contraceptive for".
7	Page 2, between lines 35 and 36, begin a new paragraph and insert:
8	"(b) The state health commissioner or the commissioner's
9	designated public authority shall, in consultation with physician
10	medical experts, establish requirements that a collaborative
11	agreement under subsection (a) must meet, including at least the
12	following:
13	(1) Be entered into between a pharmacist and a physician
14	licensed under IC 25-22.5 who prescribes hormonal
15	contraceptive patches or self-administered hormonal
16	contraceptive.
17	(2) Be in writing and submitted to the medical licensing board
18	of Indiana.
19	(3) Include a provision that requires the physician to review:
20	(A) the first fifty (50) prescription charts of the pharmacist
21	who the physician has entered into a collaborative
22	agreement with; and
23	(B) at least twenty-five percent (25%) of the pharmacist's
24	prescription charts following the fifty (50) prescriptions
25	charts described in clause (A).
26	(4) Include a plan for patients that fall outside of the standing
27	order or rules adopted by the board.
28	(5) Includes a referral plan and a provision that allows a
29	patient to elect to be seen, examined, and treated by the
30	collaborating physician.
31	(6) Requires the pharmacist to contact the collaborating
32	physician or the collaborating physician's designee if the
33	pharmacist determines that a patient needs to be examined by
34	a physician.
35	(7) Includes a plan for a patient who has an emergency
36	medical incident.
37	(c) The collaborating physician shall submit the collaborative
38	agreement with a pharmacist and any amendment to the
39	collaborative agreement to the medical licensing board of Indiana.
40	The medical licensing board of Indiana shall notify the

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collaborating physician and the pharmacist if the medical licensing board of Indiana denies the collaborative agreement. If the collaborative agreement is denied by the medical licensing board of Indiana, the pharmacist shall immediately stop prescribing a hormonal contraceptive patch or self-administered hormonal contraceptive under this chapter.

(d) A collaborating physician or pharmacist who enters into a

(d) A collaborating physician or pharmacist who enters into a collaborative agreement may be disciplined by the regulating board under IC 25-1-9 for wilfully violating the collaborative agreement.".

Page 3, line 42, delete "board" and insert "board, in consultation with the medical licensing board of Indiana,".

Page 4, line 1, after "commissioner's" insert "or designated public health authority's".

Page 4, line 2, after "chapter." insert "The board may not adopt any rules under this section that conflict with the standing order issued by the state health commissioner or designated public health authority.

Page 4, line 27, delete "level" and insert "**Level**". (Reference is to HB 1568 as reprinted February 17, 2023.)
