## DIGEST OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT

State and local tax review task force. Provides that the member of the state and local tax review task force (task force) who is an economist is appointed jointly by the president pro tempore of the senate and the speaker of the house of representatives. Provides for the selection of the chairperson and vice chairperson of the task force. Makes changes to the review topics. Deletes the appropriation.
