

COMMITTEE REPORT

MADAM PRESIDENT:

The Senate Committee on Agriculture, to which was referred Senate Bill No. 134, has had the same under consideration and begs leave to report the same back to the Senate with the recommendation that said bill be AMENDED as follows:

1	Delete committee amendment AM013402, adopted by the Senate
2	Agriculture Committee on January 23, 2023.
3	Delete everything after the enacting clause and insert the following:
4	SECTION 1. IC 15-22 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS
5	A NEW ARTICLE TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1,
6	2023]:
7	ARTICLE 22. RETAIL SALE OF DOGS
8	Chapter 1. Applicability
9	Sec. 1. This article applies only to the following:
10	(1) A city (as defined by IC 36-1-2-3).
11	(2) An incorporated town.
12	Chapter 2. Definitions
13	Sec. 1. As used in this article, "hobby breeder" means a person
14	who maintains at least five (5) and not more than twenty (20)
15	unaltered female dogs that are at least twelve (12) months of age.
16	Sec. 2. As used in this article, "kennel" means an establishment
17	that:
18	(1) operates for the:
19	(A) breeding;

1	(B) boarding;
2	(C) training; or
3	(D) sale;
4	of dogs; and
5	(2) is liable for payment of a county option dog tax, if the
6	kennel is located in a county that has adopted a tax under
7	IC 6-9-39-3.
8	Sec. 3. (a) As used in this article, "retail pet store" means a
9	commercial enterprise that sells dogs or dog accessories for profit.
10	(b) The term excludes a kennel.
11	Sec. 4. As used in this article, "unit" means a city (as defined by
12	IC 36-1-2-3) or an incorporated town.
13	Chapter 3. Ordinances and Regulations Concerning the Retail
14	Sale of Dogs
15	Sec. 1. (a) This section does not apply to a unit that adopts an
16	ordinance or regulation before January 1, 2023, that prohibits the
17	sale of dogs in retail pet stores.
18	(b) A unit may not adopt an ordinance or regulation that
19	prohibits or effectively prohibits the sale of a dog by a retail pet
20	store that acquires dogs from any of the following:
21	(1) A commercial dog broker or commercial dog breeder that
22	meets the following criteria:
23	(A) Is registered as required by IC 15-21-2-1.
24	(B) Is certified by a national science based breeder
25	standards program.
26	(C) Is audited by an independent auditing firm that
27	complies with the applicable standards of the International
28	Organization for Standardization.
29	(2) A licensee (as defined in 9 CFR 1.1) that is subject to 9
30	CFR 3.1 and has no direct violations for the previous two (2)
31	years.
32	(3) A hobby breeder.
33	Chapter 4. Sales of Dogs by Retail Pet Stores
34	Sec. 1. Before the time of sale of a dog, a retail pet store
35	operator must, to the best of the operator's knowledge, provide to
36	the consumer the following information on the dog being offered
37	for sale:
38	(1) The retail price of the dog, including any additional fees or
39	charges.
40	(2) The dog's breed or breeds, if known, age, date of birth, sex,
41	and color.
42	(3) The date and description of any inoculation or medical

1	treatment that the dog received while in the possession of the:
2	(A) retail pet store; and
3	(B) commercial dog breeder, commercial dog broker,
4	humane society, animal rescue operation, or animal
5	shelter;
6	that the retail pet store is aware of.
7	(4) If the dog was supplied by a commercial dog breeder or
8	commercial dog broker, the name and address of the
9	commercial dog breeder or commercial dog broker.
10	(5) If eligible for registration with a pedigree registry, the
11	name and registration numbers of the sire and dam and the
12	address of the pedigree registry where the sire and dam are
13	registered.
14	(6) A copy of the retail pet store's policy regarding
15	warranties, refunds, or returns, and an explanation of the
16	remedy under section 3(c) of this chapter, in addition to any
17	other remedies available at law.
18	(7) Disclosure that the dog has been microchipped and the
19	microchip has been enrolled in a nationally searchable data
20	base. Each dog must be microchipped by the retail pet store
21	operator before the sale of the dog.
22	Sec. 2. A retail pet store may not sell a dog to a person who is
23	less than eighteen (18) years of age.
24	Sec. 3. (a) A customer who purchases a dog from a retail pet
25	store is entitled to a remedy under subsection (c) if:
26	(1) within fourteen (14) days after the date of sale, a licensed
27	veterinarian states in writing that at the time of sale:
28	(A) the dog was unfit for purchase due to illness or disease
29	or the presence of symptoms of a contagious or infectious
30	disease that are extreme enough to influence the general
31	health of the dog, excluding fleas or ticks; or
32	(B) the dog has died from a disease that existed in the dog
33	on or before the date of delivery of the dog to the
34	customer; or
35	(2) within two (2) years after the date of sale, a licensed
36	veterinarian states in writing that the dog:
37	(A) possesses a congenital or hereditary condition that
38	adversely affects the health of the dog or requires either
39	hospitalization or a nonelective surgical procedure; or
40	(B) has died of a congenital or hereditary condition.
41	(b) The veterinarian's statement under subsection (a)(2) must
42	include:

1	(1) the customer's name and address;
2	(2) a statement that the veterinarian examined the dog;
3	(3) the date or dates that the dog was examined;
4	(4) the breed and age of the dog, if known;
5	(5) a statement that the dog has or had a disease, illness, or
6	congenital or hereditary condition; and
7	(6) the findings of the examination or necropsy, including any
8	lab results or copies of the results.
9	(c) A customer entitled to a remedy under this section may:
10	(1) return the dog to the retail pet store for a full refund of the
11	purchase price;
12	(2) exchange the dog for another dog of comparable value
13	chosen by the customer;
14	(3) retain the dog and be reimbursed for reasonable
15	veterinary fees for diagnosis and treatment of the dog, not to
16	exceed the purchase price of the dog; or
17	(4) if the dog is deceased, be reimbursed:
18	(A) the full purchase price of the dog; and
19	(B) reasonable veterinary fees associated with the
20	diagnosis and treatment of the dog, not to exceed the
21	purchase price of the dog.
