SENATE BILL No. 164

DIGEST OF SB 164 (Updated February 1, 2023 2:07 pm - DI 140)

Citations Affected: IC 4-31; IC 35-31.5; IC 35-45.

Synopsis: Private card games. Defines "private low stakes card game" and provides a defense to certain gambling crimes if the gambling was a private low stakes card game. Defines "cheat" for purposes of gambling law. Makes cheating at gambling a Class A misdemeanor, and increases the penalty for the offense based on the gain obtained by cheating. Makes conforming amendments.

Effective: July 1, 2023.

14	(2) bona fide business transactions that are valid under the law of
15	contracts.
16	(c) (f) "Gambling device" means:
17	(1) a mechanism by the operation of which a right to money or
18	other property may be credited, in return for consideration, as the
19	result of the operation of an element of chance;
20	(2) a mechanism that, when operated for a consideration, does not
20	return the same value or property for the same consideration upon
22	each operation;
23	(3) a mechanism, furniture, fixture, construction, or installation
24	designed primarily for use in connection with professional
25	gambling;
26	(4) a policy ticket or wheel; or
27	(5) a subassembly or essential part designed or intended for use
28	in connection with such a device, mechanism, furniture, fixture,
29	construction, or installation.
30	In the application of this definition, an immediate and unrecorded right
31	to replay mechanically conferred on players of pinball machines and
32	similar amusement devices is presumed to be without value.
33	(f) (g) "Gambling information" means:
34	(1) a communication with respect to a wager made in the course
35	of professional gambling; or
36	(2) information intended to be used for professional gambling.
37	(g) (h) "Interactive computer service" means an Internet service, an
38	information service, a system, or an access software provider that
<u>39</u>	provides or enables computer access to a computer served by multiple

7	of the following apply:
8	(1) The gambling is in the form of a card game played with
9	physical cards.
10	(2) If the card game is a banking game, each player takes
11	turns acting as the banker.
12	(3) No person receives a fixed share or percentage of the
13	stakes.
14	(4) The gambling does not involve the use of an electronic
15	gaming device, an electronic version of a card game, or the
16	Internet.
17	(5) The gambling occurs in a private residence and is not open
18	to the public.
19	(6) Not more than twelve (12) players participate.
20	(7) The maximum amount of gambling losses that a player
