HOUSE BILL No. 1024

DIGEST OF HB 1024 (Updated January 8, 2026 9:26 am - DI 140)

Citations Affected: IC 21-13.

Synopsis: Veterinary student loan repayment program. Establishes the veterinary medicine student loan repayment program (program) and the veterinary medicine student loan repayment fund (fund). Provides that the Indiana state board of animal health shall administer the program and the fund.

HOUSE BILL No. 1024

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning higher education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 21-13-1-5, AS AMENDED BY P.L.232-2025,
2 SECTION 20, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3 JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 5. "Fund":

4 (1) for purposes of IC 21-13-2, refers to the William A. Crawford
5 minority teacher scholarship fund established by IC 21-13-2-1;
6 (2) for purposes of IC 21-13-4, refers to the National Guard
7 tuition supplement program fund established by IC 21-13-4-1;
8 (3) for purposes of IC 21-13-5, refers to the National Guard
9 scholarship extension fund established by IC 21-13-5-1;
10 (4) for purposes of IC 21-13-6, refers to the primary care
11 physician loan forgiveness fund established by IC 21-13-6-3;
12 (5) for purposes of IC 21-13-6.5, refers to the medical residency
13 education fund established by IC 21-13-6.5-1; **and**
14 (6) for purposes of IC 21-13-12, refers to the county deputy
15 prosecuting attorney and public defender scholarship fund
16 established by IC 21-13-12-6; **and**
17 (7) **for purposes of IC 21-13-13, refers to the veterinary**

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medicine student loan repayment program fund established by IC 21-13-13-3.

SECTION 2. IC 21-13-13 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2026]:

Chapter 13. Veterinary Medicine Student Loan Repayment Program

Sec. 1. For purposes of this chapter, the following definitions apply:

- (1) "Fund" refers to the veterinary medicine student loan repayment program fund established by section 3 of this chapter.
- (2) "Program" refers to the veterinary medicine student loan repayment program established by section 2 of this chapter.

Sec. 2. (a) The veterinary medicine student loan repayment program is established.

(b) The Indiana state board of animal health shall administer the program.

Sec. 3. (a) The veterinary medicine student loan repayment program fund is established to provide funds to repay outstanding student loans of:

- (1) veterinarians; or
- (2) veterinary technicians;

who meet the requirements established by the Indiana state board of animal health.

(b) The Indiana state board of animal health shall administer the fund.

(c) The fund consists of the following:

- (1) Appropriations from the general assembly.**
- (2) Grants, including federal grants.**
- (3) Gifts or donations to the Indiana state board of animal health to achieve the purposes of the fund.**
- (4) Interest accrued under subsection (d).**

(d) The treasurer of state shall invest the money in the fund not currently needed to meet the obligations of the fund in the same manner as other public funds may be invested. Interest that accrues from investments under this subsection must be deposited in the fund.

(e) Money in the fund at the end of a state fiscal year does not revert to the state general fund.

(f) The expenses of administering the fund may be paid from money in the fund but must not exceed the amounts deposited in



1 **the fund under subsection (c)(1), (c)(2), and (c)(4).**

2 **(g) A person that provides money to the fund under subsection**
3 **(c)(3) may direct that the money be used for loan repayments for**
4 **a specific:**

5 **(1) veterinarian practice type; or**

6 **(2) geographic area of Indiana.**

7 **Sec. 4. The Indiana state board of animal health shall do the**
8 **following:**

9 **(1) Establish requirements for the program.**

10 **(2) Identify individuals who qualify for the program.**

11 **(3) Determine the amount and duration of the student loan**
12 **repayment award that an eligible individual receives.**

13 **(4) Identify areas of need.**

14 **Sec. 5. (a) To be eligible to receive a student loan repayment**
15 **award, an individual must meet the following requirements:**

16 **(1) Apply on a form prescribed by the Indiana state board of**
17 **animal health.**

18 **(2) Be a:**

19 **(A) licensed, accredited veterinarian; or**

20 **(B) registered veterinarian technician;**

21 **who is licensed or registered under IC 25-38.1-3.**

22 **(3) Be a resident of Indiana and a citizen of the United States.**

23 **(4) Have an outstanding student loan balance from loans**
24 **secured during professional training at an accredited:**

25 **(A) college of veterinary medicine; or**

26 **(B) veterinary technician program.**

27 **(5) Agree to practice full time in the veterinary profession and**
28 **provide essential services in Indiana for a specific number of**
29 **years as determined by the Indiana state board of animal**
30 **health. When determining essential services in Indiana, the**
31 **Indiana state board of animal health shall consider the**
32 **following factors:**

33 **(A) Rural or other geographic areas of the state that are**
34 **currently underserved.**

35 **(B) Food animal or other areas of veterinary practice that**
36 **are either:**

37 **(i) currently experiencing; or**

38 **(ii) projected to experience;**

39 **a shortage of veterinary practitioners or veterinary**
40 **technicians.**

41 **(C) Any other factor that:**

42 **(i) furthers the protection of human and animal health;**



and

(ii) ensures the efficient and principled delivery of veterinary medical services in Indiana.

(b) The Indiana state board of animal health shall:

(1) determine the amount of a student loan repayment award that an eligible individual receives under this chapter; and
(2) establish the process for an eligible individual to receive multi-year awards under this chapter.

Sec. 6. The Indiana state board of animal health shall transfer student loan repayment awards under this chapter directly to the holder of the eligible individual's outstanding student loans.

Sec. 7. The Indiana state board of animal health may make student loan repayment awards to an eligible individual until the balance of the eligible individual's student loans is paid in full.

Sec. 8. (a) The Indiana state board of animal health shall prepare a report that includes the following:

(1) The receipt, disbursement, and uses of money from the fund.

(2) The number of applications submitted for student loan repayment under the program.

(3) The number and amount of student loan repayment awards that have been provided.

(4) An evaluation of the short term and long term impact of the program on Indiana's delivery of veterinary medical services.

(5) Any other information collected concerning the fund, program, or student loan repayments awarded under this chapter.

(b) Not later than July 1, 2027, and not later than July 1 every two (2) years thereafter, the Indiana state board of animal health shall submit the report described in subsection (a) to the following:

(1) The governor.

(2) The general assembly in an electronic format under IC 5-14-6.

Sec. 9. The Indiana state board of animal health shall adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 to:

- (1) establish eligibility requirements to receive student loan repayment awards under the program; and
- (2) otherwise administer the program.
