DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 31-9-2-58.1; IC 31-34-1-1; IC 35-31.5-2-168.2; IC 35-46-1.

Synopsis: Permissible unsupervised activity. Defines "independent activity". Provides that a child is not a child in need of services solely because a parent, guardian, or custodian allows the child to engage in an independent activity unless the parent, guardian, or custodian is so reckless in allowing the child to engage in the independent activity that it endangers the child's health or safety given the child's maturity, condition, and ability. Provides a defense for neglect of a dependent that the accused person reasonably believed that an independent activity was not dangerous.

Effective: July 1, 2026.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning family law and juvenile law.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 31-9-2-58.1 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE

3	1, 2026]: Sec. 58.1. "Independent activity", for purposes of

8	(3) Remaining at home.

10	SECTION 2. IC 31-34-1-1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.198-2019,
11	SECTION 8, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
12	JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 1. A child is a child in need of services if before
13	the child becomes eighteen (18) years of age:
14	(1) the child's physical or mental condition is seriously impaired
15	or seriously endangered as a result of the inability, refusal, or
16	neglect of the child's parent, guardian, or custodian to supply the
17	child with necessary food, clothing, shelter, medical care,

4	(B) due to the failure, refusal, or inability of the parent,
