Summary of Legislation: This bill requires the Department of Child Services (DCS) to have in-person contact with an alleged victim of child abuse or neglect: (1) before concluding an assessment; and (2) before dismissing or terminating a pending child in need of services case with the juvenile court.

Effective Date: July 1, 2026.

Explanation of State Expenditures: In the most recent Child Welfare Policy manual publication, the DCS adheres to the following timelines for in-person assessments after a local office receives notification of suspected child abuse or neglect:

- (1) Two hours if the allegations would cause a reasonable person to believe the child is in imminent danger of serious bodily harm;
- (2) Twenty-four hours if the allegations involve abuse but the conditions in item (1) do not apply; or
- (3) Five days if the allegations involve neglect and none of the conditions in items (1) or (2).

It is assumed the DCS's current policy on in-person assessments in these situations would satisfy what is included in the bill.
