HB 1052 # 24

DIGEST

Charity gaming. Allows an operator, a worker, or a volunteer ticket agent who is not a full-time employee to receive remuneration of not more than \$50 for conducting or assisting in conducting an allowable activity.

- 1 Page 9, between lines 25 and 26, begin a new paragraph and insert:
2 "SECTION 13. IC 4-32.3-5-8, AS ADDED BY P.L.58-2019,
3 SECTION 4, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
4 JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 8. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) or (c),
5 an operator, a worker, or a volunteer ticket agent who is not a full-time
6 employee may ~~not~~ receive remuneration **of not more than fifty dollars**
7 **(\$50)** for:
8 (1) conducting; or
9 (2) assisting in conducting;
10 an allowable activity.
11 **(b) In addition to the remuneration permitted under subsection**
12 **(a),** a qualified organization that conducts an allowable activity may:
13 (1) provide meals for the operators and workers during the
14 allowable event; and
15 (2) provide recognition dinners and social events for the operators
16 and workers;
17 if the value of the meals and social events does not constitute a
18 ~~significant inducement to participate~~ **an unreasonable expense** in the
19 conduct of the allowable activity.
20 (c) In the case of a qualified organization selling pull tabs,
21 punchboards, or tip boards under an annual activity license, any
22 employee of the qualified organization may:
23 (1) participate in the sale and redemption of pull tabs,
24 punchboards, or tip boards on the premises of the qualified
25 organization; and
26 (2) receive the remuneration ordinarily provided to the employee

- 1 in the course of the employee's employment."
- 2 Renumber all SECTIONS consecutively.
