DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 21-18-9-10.7.

Synopsis: Emergency medical services. Exempts state educational institution degree programs primarily focused on emergency medical services from a certain elimination provision.

Effective: July 1, 2026.

HOUSE BILL No. 1060

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning higher education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 21-18-9-10.7, AS ADDED BY P.L.213-2025,
2 SECTION 248, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
3 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 10.7. (a) **Except as provided in**
4 **subsection (c)**, for each state educational institution degree program,
5 if the:
6 (1) average number of students who graduate over the
7 immediately preceding three (3) years is fewer than:
8 (A) ten (10) students for a particular associate degree program;
9 (B) fifteen (15) students for a particular bachelor's degree
10 program;
11 (C) seven (7) students for a particular master's degree
12 program;
13 (D) three (3) students for a particular education specialist
14 program; or
15 (E) three (3) students for a particular doctorate degree
16 program; and
17 (2) state educational institution would like to continue a degree



1 program described in subdivision (1);
2 the state educational institution must request approval from the
3 commission to continue the degree program.
4 (b) If the commission does not grant approval under subsection (a),
5 the state educational institution must eliminate:
6 (1) the degree program; and
7 (2) any costs associated with the degree program.
8 **(c) This section does not apply to a state educational institution**
9 **degree program primarily focused on emergency medical services**
10 **(as defined in IC 16-18-2-110).**
