IMPACT: State & Local

Summary of Legislation: The bill specifies restrictions that apply to wake boarding or wake surfing on a public freshwater lake. It establishes a penalty. It specifies restrictions that apply to wake boarding or wake surfing on a small lake.

Effective Date: July 1, 2026.

Explanation of State Expenditures: The bill may increase workload for the Law Enforcement Division of the Department of Natural Resources to enforce the provisions of the bill regarding wake boarding and wake surfing. The Division should be able to implement the provisions using existing staffing and resources.

Explanation of State Revenues: The bill establishes Class C infractions regarding wake boarding and wake surfing. If additional court cases occur and infraction judgments and court fees are collected, revenue to the state General Fund may increase. The maximum judgment for a Class C infraction is \$500, which is deposited in the state General Fund. Fee revenue per case ranges from \$85.50 and \$103, depending on whether the case is filed in a court of record or a municipal court.
