Summary of Legislation: This bill establishes the Hoosier Scam Prevention Board.

Effective Date: July 1, 2026.

Explanation of State Expenditures: The bill establishes the Hoosier Scam Prevention Board (Board) to be staffed by the Family and Social Services Administration (FSSA). The Board is comprised of 15 members, appointed by the Governor, each entitled to reimbursement for mileage and traveling expenses to be paid by the FSSA. The Board is required to meet at least once per year. Total expenses for the Board will depend on the number of meetings held. As of June 15, 2022, mileage reimbursement is \$0.49 per mile.

Workload will increase for the FSSA, the Governor's Office, and each agency with membership on the Board, but should be able to be implemented using existing staffing and resources.

Additional Information - The following state entities will have a representative on the Board: the Attorney General, Department of Insurance (DOI), State Medicaid Fraud Control Unit, State Police, Adult Protective Services Unit, Department of Financial Institutions (DFI), Long-term Care Ombudsman, Consumer Protection Division of the Office of the Attorney General, and FSSA's Division of Aging. *[The DOI and DFI are funded through dedicated agency funds.]*
