Proposed Changes to introduced printing by AM108604

## DIGEST OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Protected writings. Removes all language in the bill and includes the Ten Commandments on a list of protected writings, documents, and records. Provides that a principal or teacher may not read the Ten Commandments when students are present.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

 19      permanent collection at least one (1) copy of each writing or document  
 20      listed in subsection (a)(1) through (a)(9) and subsection (a)(16).  
 21      (e) A school corporation:  
 22        (1) shall allow a student to include a reference to a writing,  
 23        document, or record listed in subsection (a) in a report or other  
 24        work product; and  
 25        (2) may not punish the student in any way, including a reduction  
 26        in grade, for using the reference.
