<u>Summary of Legislation:</u> This bill provides that, subject to available funding, the Division of Mental Health and Addiction (DMHA) may develop an application to provide funds to a school corporation or school maintained by a school corporation to obtain a federal Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approved opioid overdose reversal medication. This bill also provides that the State Health Commissioner shall issue a statewide standing order, prescription, or protocol for a federal FDA approved opioid overdose reversal medication for each public school or school corporation.

Effective Date: July 1, 2026.

Explanation of State Expenditures: The bill's requirements for DMHA and the Indiana Department of Health (IDOH) are within the agencies' routine administrative functions and should be able to be implemented with no additional appropriations, assuming near customary agency staffing and resource levels. [The IDOH's administrative expenditures are currently paid from the Tobacco Master Settlement Fund, a dedicated fund.]

<u>Additional information</u> - The IDOH Commissioner currently issues an annual standing order for Indiana K-12 schools to stock emergency medications, including opioid reversal medication. There are 1,822 public schools and 316 nonpublic schools subject to this standing order in Indiana.

The DMHA currently uses federal grant funding to provide schools with opioid overdose reversal medication free of charge via Overdose Lifeline.
