<u>Summary of Legislation:</u> This bill adds Parkinson's disease to the definition of "chronic disease" for provisions concerning the Chronic Disease Registry.

Effective Date: July 1, 2026.

Explanation of State Expenditures: The bill will increase workload for the Indiana Department of Health (IDOH) to manage the additional registry data and for the Family and Social Services Administration to report to the registry any confirmed cases of Parkinson's disease for individuals covered under the state Medicaid program and data regarding services provided to such individuals. Both agencies should be able to implement the bill's requirements using existing staffing and resources. [The IDOH's administrative expenditures are currently paid from the Tobacco Master Settlement Fund, a dedicated fund.]

<u>Additional Information:</u> A 2022 study estimated that approximately 21,300 Hoosiers had a diagnosis of Parkinson's disease. Age is the primary factor associated with the incidence of the disease.

Explanation of State Revenues:

<u>Explanation of Local Expenditures:</u> The bill's requirements will increase workload for locally-owned hospitals to report confirmed cases of Parkinson's disease to the registry but should be able to be implemented using existing staffing and resources.
