IMPACT: State & Local

Summary of Legislation: This bill requires, upon request, a public school to consult with and allow certain licensed or board certified behavior analysts and certified registered behavior technicians to provide applied behavioral analysis therapy services in the public school to a student under certain conditions in accordance with the student's special education program or plan. The bill provides immunity from civil liability for any actions taken in good faith to comply with the requirements. It requires the Department of Education to prepare and provide information and guidance to assist public schools in implementing the requirements.

Effective Date: July 1, 2026.

Explanation of State Expenditures: The Department of Education will experience a minor workload increase to provide the necessary information to public schools. The bill's requirements are within the agency's routine administrative functions and should be able to be implemented with no additional appropriations, assuming near customary agency staffing and resource levels.

Explanation of State Revenues:

Explanation of Local Expenditures: The bill's provisions require the certified behavior analyst to pay for all costs associated with obtaining the background checks required to work in a public school. Public schools who elect to pay for these checks would experience a minor expenditure increase.
