## HOUSE BILL No. 1137

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 20-26-9-20 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA  
2 CODE AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS  
3 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2026]: **Sec. 20. (a) As used in this section,**  
4 **"prohibited ingredient" means any of the following ingredients:**  
5 (1) Potassium bromate (CAS 7758-01-02).  
6 (2) Propylparaben (CAS 94-13-3).  
7 (3) Titanium dioxide (CAS 13463-67-7).  
8 (4) Yellow dye 5 (CAS 1934-21-0).  
9 (5) Yellow dye 6 (CAS 2783-94-0).  
10 (6) Blue dye 1 (CAS 3844-45-9).  
11 (7) Blue dye 2 (CAS 860-22-0).  
12 (8) Green dye 3 (CAS 2353-45-9).  
13 (9) Red dye 3 (CAS 16423-68-0).  
14 (10) Red dye 40 (CAS 25956-17-6).  
15 (11) Butylated hydroxytoluene (BHT) (CAS 128-37-0).

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1 (12) Tert-butylhydroquinone (TBHQ) (CAS 1948-33-0).

2 (13) Azodicarbonamide (CAS 123-77-3).

3 (b) Beginning with the 2027-2028 school year and except as  
4 provided in subsection (c), a public school, including a charter  
5 school, that participates in a federally funded or assisted meal  
6 program:

7 (1) may not serve, sell, or allow a third party vendor to serve  
8 or sell a food or beverage that contains a prohibited  
9 ingredient on school property on a school day; and

10 (2) shall post on the school's website the school's breakfast  
11 and lunch menu, as applicable, with the list of ingredients for  
12 each item on the menu.

13 (c) A school described in subsection (b) may sell or permit the  
14 sale of a food or beverage that contains a prohibited ingredient on  
15 school property as part of a fundraising event if the sale of the food  
16 or beverage occurs at least thirty (30) minutes after the end of the  
17 school day.

18 (d) This section does not prohibit the parent of a student from  
19 providing a food or beverage that contains a prohibited ingredient  
20 to the student during the school day.

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
