## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 25-2.1-3.

**Synopsis:** Licensure of certified public accountants. Provides that an individual is eligible to take the examination for licensure as a certified public accountant if the individual has at least a baccalaureate degree with a concentration in accounting or equivalent as determined by the board to be appropriate.

**Effective:** July 1, 2026; January 1, 2027.
