## **HOUSE BILL No. 1160**

## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 20-30-5; IC 20-32-4-21.

**Synopsis:** Naturalization examination. Beginning in the 2026-2027 school year, requires administration of the naturalization examination provided by the United States Citizenship and Immigration Services (exam) in grade 8. Beginning in the 2030-2031 school year, requires administration of the exam in high school, and requires a student to complete the exam with a score of not less than 70% in order to graduate high school. Allows a student to retake the exam. Allows certain students to obtain an academic waiver for the exam. Makes conforming changes.

Effective: July 1, 2026.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

31	general assembly the information under subsection (b), the department
32	shall post the pass rate under subsection (b)(3) on the department's
33	website. This subsection expires June 30, 2030.
34	SECTION 2. IC 20-30-5-26.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA
35	CODE AS A <b>NEW</b> SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS
36	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 26.5. (a) Each school shall
37	administer the naturalization examination provided by the United
38	States Citizenship and Immigration Services according to the

17	AS A <b>NEW</b> SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
18	1, 2026]: Sec. 21. (a) This section applies to an individual who is a
19	student in a cohort that is expected to graduate in 2031 or
20	thereafter from a:
21	(1) public school, including a charter school; or
22	(2) state accredited nonpublic school.
23	(b) Beginning in 2031, in addition to completing the graduation
24	requirements set forth in this article, a student described in this
25	section must successfully complete the naturalization examination
26	provided by the United States Citizenship and Immigration
27	Services with a score of seventy percent (70%) or higher to
28	graduate from high school. A student who achieves a score of
29	seventy percent (70%) or higher during the administration of the
30	naturalization exam described in IC 20-30-5-26.5(a)(1) has satisfied
31	this requirement.
32	(c) A student described in this section who fails to achieve a
33	score of seventy percent (70%) or higher during the administration
34	of the naturalization exam described in IC 20-30-5-26.5(a)(2) may
35	retake the naturalization exam.
36	(d) A student described in this section who:
37	(1) has an individualized education program; and
38	(2) earns a certificate of completion;
39	may be granted an academic waiver for the requirement described in subsection (b).
