DIGEST OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Advertising of illegal products. Repeals the applicability section for the chapter concerning the prohibition on advertising certain illegal products. Provides that an advertisement that violates the prohibition on advertising certain illegal products must be removed from public circulation not later than October 1, 2026.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning motor vehicles.
