DIGEST OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Supplemental fee. Provides that the supplemental fee for electric and hybrid vehicles does not apply to low speed vehicles.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning motor vehicles.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 8 motor driven cycles.
- 9 (b) As used in this section, "electric vehicle" means a vehicle that:
- 10 (1) is propelled by an electric motor powered by a battery or
- 11 other electrical device incorporated into the vehicle; and
- 12 (2) is not propelled by an engine powered by the combustion of
- 13 a hydrocarbon fuel, including gasoline, diesel, propane, or liquid
- 14 natural gas.
- 15 (c) As used in this section, "hybrid vehicle" means a vehicle that:
- 16 (1) draws propulsion energy from both an internal combustion
- 17 engine and an energy storage device; and
- 18 (2) employs a regenerative braking system to recover waste
- 19 energy to charge the energy storage device that is providing
- 20 propulsion energy.
