A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning  
taxation.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 4-23-7.3-5.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA  
2 CODE AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS  
3 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2026]: **Sec. 5.5. As used in this chapter,**

- 4 (A) oil, gas, or other minerals that are subject to a security

- 8 (ii) attaches to the minerals as extracted; or
- 9 (B) accounts arising out of the sale at the wellhead or
- 10 minehead of oil, gas, or other minerals in which the debtor had
- 11 an interest before extraction.
- 12 (7) The following terms have the following meanings:
- 13 (A) "Assignee", except as used in "assignee for benefit of
- 14 creditors", means a person (i) in whose favor a security interest
- 15 that secures an obligation is created or provided for under a
- 16 security agreement, whether or not the obligation is
- 17 outstanding or (ii) to which an account, chattel paper, payment
- 18 intangible, or promissory note has been sold. The term
- 19 includes a person to which a security interest has been
- 20 transferred by a secured party.
- 21 (B) "Assignor" means a person that (i) under a security
- 22 agreement creates or provides for a security interest that
- 23 secures an obligation or (ii) sells an account, chattel paper,
- 24 payment intangible, or promissory note. The term includes a
- 25 secured party that has transferred a security interest to another
- 26 person.
- 27 (8) "Bank" means an organization that is engaged in the business
- 28 of banking. The term includes savings banks, savings and loan
- 29 associations, credit unions, and trust companies.
- 30 (9) "Cash proceeds" means proceeds that are money, checks,
- 31 deposit accounts, or the like.
- 32 (10) "Certificate of title" means a certificate of title with respect
- 33 to which a statute provides for the security interest in question to
- 34 be indicated on the certificate as a condition or result of the
- 35 security interest's obtaining priority over the rights of a lien
- 36 creditor with respect to the collateral. The term includes another
- 37 record maintained as an alternative to a certificate of title by the

- 24 (13) "Commercial tort claim" means a claim arising in tort with

- 27 (B) the claimant is an individual and the claim:
- 28 (i) arose in the course of the claimant's business or
- 29 profession; and
- 30 (ii) does not include damages arising out of personal injury
- 31 to or the death of an individual.
- 32 (14) "Commodity account" means an account maintained by a
- 33 commodity intermediary in which a commodity contract is carried
- 34 for a commodity customer.
- 35 (15) "Commodity contract" means a commodity futures contract,
- 36 an option on a commodity futures contract, a commodity option,
- 37 or another contract if the contract or option is:
- 38 (A) traded on or subject to the rules of a board of trade that has
- 39 been designated as a contract market for such a contract
- 40 pursuant to federal commodities laws; or
- 41 (B) traded on a foreign commodity board of trade, exchange,
- 42 or market, and is carried on the books of a commodity

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- 1 intermediary for a commodity customer.
- 2 (16) "Commodity customer" means a person for which a
- 3 commodity intermediary carries a commodity contract on its
- 4 books.
- 5 (17) "Commodity intermediary" means a person that:
- 6 (A) is registered as a futures commission merchant under
- 7 federal commodities law; or
- 8 (B) in the ordinary course of its business provides clearance or
- 9 settlement services for a board of trade that has been
- 10 designated as a contract market pursuant to federal
- 11 commodities law.
- 12 (18) "Communicate" means:
- 13 (A) to send a written or other tangible record;
- 14 (B) to transmit a record by any means agreed upon by the
- 15 persons sending and receiving the record; or
- 16 (C) in the case of transmission of a record to or by a filing
- 17 office, to transmit a record by any means prescribed by
- 18 filing-office rule.
- 19 (19) "Consignee" means a merchant to which goods are delivered
- 20 in a consignment.
- 21 (20) "Consignment" means a transaction, regardless of its form,
- 22 in which a person delivers goods to a merchant for the purpose of
- 23 sale and:
- 24 (A) the merchant:
- 25 (i) deals in goods of that kind under a name other than the
- 26 name of the person making delivery;
- 27 (ii) is not an auctioneer; and

- 28 (C) "Controllable payment intangible" means a payment
- 29 intangible evidenced by a controllable electronic record that

- 33 (28) "Debtor" means:
- 34 (A) a person having an interest, other than a security interest

- 40 (29) "Deposit account" means a demand, time, savings, passbook,

- 8 (33) "Equipment" means goods other than inventory, farm

- 10 (34) "Farm products" means goods, other than standing timber,
- 11 with respect to which the debtor is engaged in a farming operation

  - 13 (A) crops grown, growing, or to be grown, including:
    - 14 (i) crops produced on trees, vines, and bushes; and
    - 15 (ii) aquatic goods produced in aquacultural operations;

- 26 (37) "Filing office" means an office designated in IC 26-1-9.1-501

- 28 (38) "Filing-office rule" means a rule adopted pursuant to
- 29 IC 26-1-9.1-526.
- 30 (39) "Financing statement" means a record or records composed
- 31 of an initial financing statement and any filed record relating to
- 32 the initial financing statement.
- 33 (40) "Fixture filing" means the filing of a financing statement
- 34 covering goods that are or are to become fixtures and satisfying
- 35 IC 26-1-9.1-502(a) and IC 26-1-9.1-502(b). The term includes the
- 36 filing of a financing statement covering goods of a transmitting
- 37 utility which are or are to become fixtures.
- 38 (41) "Fixtures" means goods that have become so related to
- 39 particular real property that an interest in them arises under real
- 40 property law.
- 41 (42) "General intangible" means any personal property, including
- 42 things in action, other than accounts, chattel paper, commercial

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1 tort claims, deposit accounts, documents, goods, instruments,  
 2 investment property, letter-of-credit rights, letters of credit,  
 3 money, and oil, gas, or other minerals before extraction. The term  
 4 includes controllable electronic records, payment intangibles, and  
 5 software.

6 (43) "Good faith" means honesty in fact and the observance of  
 7 reasonable commercial standards of fair dealing.

8 (44) "Goods" means all things that are movable when a security  
 9 interest attaches. The term includes (i) fixtures, (ii) standing  
 10 timber that is to be cut and removed under a conveyance or  
 11 contract for sale, (iii) the unborn young of animals, (iv) crops

 29 The allocation provision may apply to all or part of the redevelopment  
 30 project area. The allocation provision must require that any property  
 31 taxes subsequently levied by or for the benefit of any public body  
 32 entitled to a distribution of property taxes on taxable property in the  
 33 allocation area be allocated and distributed as follows:

34 (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, the proceeds of  
 35 the taxes attributable to the lesser of:

36 (A) the assessed value of the property for the assessment date  
 37 with respect to which the allocation and distribution is made;  
 38 or

39 (B) the base assessed value;

40 shall be allocated to and, when collected, paid into the funds of  
 41 the respective taxing units.

42 (2) This subdivision applies to a fire protection territory

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1 established after December 31, 2022. If a unit becomes a  
2 participating unit of a fire protection territory that is established  
3 after a declaratory resolution is adopted under section 15 of this  
4 chapter, the excess of the proceeds of the property taxes  
5 attributable to an increase in the property tax rate for the  
6 participating unit of a fire protection territory:

7 (A) except as otherwise provided by this subdivision, shall be  
8 determined as follows:

9 STEP ONE: Divide the unit's tax rate for fire protection for  
10 the year before the establishment of the fire protection  
11 territory by the participating unit's tax rate as part of the fire

 26 (F) Make payments on leases payable from allocated tax  
 27 proceeds in that allocation area under section 25.2 of this

 29 (G) Reimburse the unit for expenditures made by it for local  
 30 public improvements (which include buildings, parking  
 31 facilities, and other items described in section 25.1(a) of this  
 32 chapter) that are physically located in or physically connected  
 33 to that allocation area.  
 34 (H) Reimburse the unit for rentals paid by it for a building or  
 35 parking facility that is physically located in or physically  
 36 connected to that allocation area under any lease entered into  
 37 under IC 36-1-10.  
 38 (I) For property taxes first due and payable before January 1,  
 39 2009, pay all or a part of a property tax replacement credit to  
 40 taxpayers in an allocation area as determined by the  
 41 redevelopment commission. This credit equals the amount  
 42 determined under the following STEPS for each taxpayer in a

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1 taxing district (as defined in IC 6-1.1-1-20) that contains all or  
 2 part of the allocation area:  
 3 STEP ONE: Determine that part of the sum of the amounts  
 4 under IC 6-1.1-21-2(g)(1)(A), IC 6-1.1-21-2(g)(2),  
 5 IC 6-1.1-21-2(g)(3), IC 6-1.1-21-2(g)(4), and  
 6 IC 6-1.1-21-2(g)(5) (before their repeal) that is attributable to

- 32 recent assessment date minus the base assessed value, when

 7 means taxes imposed under IC 6-1.1 on real property.

8 (b) A resolution adopted under section 40 of this chapter on or  
 9 before the allocation deadline determined under subsection (i) may  
 10 include a provision with respect to the allocation and distribution of  
 11 property taxes for the purposes and in the manner provided in this  
 12 section. A resolution previously adopted may include an allocation  
 13 provision by the amendment of that resolution on or before the

30 **Sec. 5. As used in this chapter, "district plan" means a proposal**  
31 **for a district that contains the information described in section 9(c)**  
32 **of this chapter.**

33 **Sec. 6. As used in this chapter, "improvements" means the**  
34 **acquisition, construction, installation, or maintenance of any**  
35 **tangible property in the district with an estimated useful life of five**  
36 **(5) years or more.**

37 **Sec. 7. As used in this chapter, "legislative body" has the**  
38 **meaning set forth in IC 36-1-2-9.**

39 **Sec. 8. As used in this chapter, "owner" refers to any person**  
40 **recognized by the unit as the owner of a business within the**  
41 **district, without regard to whether the person is the owner of the**  
42 **real property on which the business is located.**

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1           **Sec. 9. (a) A person that intends to file a petition for the**  
 2 **establishment of a district under this section must first provide**  
 3 **written notice to the clerk (as defined in IC 36-1-2-4) in the case of**  
 4 **a municipality, or the county auditor in the case of a county, of the**  
 5 **person's intent before initiating the petition process.**

6           **(b) A petition for the establishment of a district may be filed**

 4 identifying the district management association, including the

 6 governance structure and any proposed rules or regulations  
 7 that may be applicable to the district.  
 8 (8) A statement indicating where a complete copy of the  
 9 district plan, whether in hard copy or electronic form, may be  
 10 obtained or accessed.  
 11 (9) Any other item or matter required to be incorporated in  
 12 the district plan by the unit's legislative body. The legislative  
 13 body may require in the district plan that the boundaries of  
 14 the district be drawn to:  
 15 (A) exclude businesses; or  
 16 (B) prevent overlap of the district with another district or  
 17 area in which a special assessment is imposed.  
 18 **Sec. 9.5.** Owners of the following property may not be included  
 19 within the territory of a district and the owners of such property

 36 **Sec. 11. (a)** A special assessment on businesses located within the
