Summary of Legislation: This bill establishes a process concerning eligibility for advanced DNA testing for cold cases.

Effective Date: July 1, 2026.

Explanation of State Expenditures: The bill may increase workload and expenditures for a law enforcement agency to agree to a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with a qualified entity and transfer the DNA evidence to a lab with advanced DNA testing at the notice from a qualified entity. The increase in workload and expenditures will depend if a law enforcement agency agrees to an MOU with a qualified entity, a victim, an eligible family member of a cold case victim, or a county coroner submits a request, and whether a qualified entity deems the request eligible. This workload and expenditure increase should be done within current resources.
