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## COMMITTEE REPORT

### MR. SPEAKER:

*Your Committee on Public Health, to which was referred House Bill 1254, has had the same under consideration and begs leave to report the same back to the House with the recommendation that said bill **be amended** as follows:*

- 1       Page 4, after line 18, begin a new paragraph and insert:
- 2       "SECTION 6. IC 25-34.5-2-8 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
- 3       FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 8. (a) Each applicant
- 4       for licensure as a respiratory care practitioner must present satisfactory
- 5       evidence that the applicant:
- 6           (1) does not have a conviction for:
- 7              (A) an act that would constitute a ground for disciplinary
- 8              sanction under IC 25-1-9; or
- 9              (B) a crime that has a direct bearing on the practitioner's
- 10             ability to practice competently;
- 11           (2) has not been the subject of a disciplinary action initiated by
- 12             the licensing or certification agency of another state or
- 13             jurisdiction on the grounds that the applicant was unable to

1 practice as a respiratory care practitioner without endangering the  
2 public; and

3 (3) has either:

4 (A) before January 1, 2028, passed a respiratory care  
5 practitioner licensing or certification examination approved by  
6 the board; or

7 (B) after December 31, 2027, successfully completed both  
8 portions of the registered respiratory therapist  
9 examination, administered by the National Board for  
10 Respiratory Care or its successor organization.

11 (b) Each applicant for licensure as a respiratory care practitioner  
12 must submit proof to the committee of the applicant's:

13 (1) graduation from a school or program of respiratory care that  
14 meets standards set by the board;

15 (2) completion of a United States military training program in  
16 respiratory care; or

17 (3) completion of sufficient postsecondary education to be  
18 credentialed by a national respiratory care practitioner  
19 organization approved by the committee.

20 (c) At the time of making application, each applicant must pay a fee  
21 determined by the board after consideration of a recommendation of  
22 the committee.

23 SECTION 7. IC 25-34.5-2-9, AS AMENDED BY P.L.177-2015,  
24 SECTION 75, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
25 JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 9. (a) Except as provided in section 11 of this  
26 chapter, the committee shall issue a license to each applicant who

27 (1) successfully passes the examination provided in section 12 of  
28 this chapter; and

29 (2) meets the requirements of section 8 of this chapter.

30 (b) Subject to IC 25-1-2-6(e), a license issued under this section  
31 expires on the last day of the regular renewal cycle established under  
32 IC 25-1-5-4.

33 SECTION 8. IC 25-34.5-2-10.1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.149-2022,  
34 SECTION 12, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
35 JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 10.1. (a) The committee shall issue a temporary  
36 permit to a person to practice respiratory care or to profess to be a  
37 respiratory care practitioner, not more than thirty (30) days after the  
38 application is filed and completed, if the person pays a fee and:

1 (1) has:

2 (A) a valid license or certificate to practice from another state;

3 and

4 (B) applied for a license from the committee;

5 (2) is practicing in a state that does not license or certify

6 respiratory care practitioners but is credentialed by a national

7 respiratory care practitioner association approved by the

8 committee, and the person has applied for a license from the

9 committee; or

10 (3) has:

11 (A) been approved by the committee to take the next

12 examination; and

13 (B) graduated from a school or program approved by the

14 committee. is qualified to take the examination by being a

15 graduate of a school or program of respiratory care that

16 meets standards set by the board.

17 (b) A temporary permit expires the earlier of:

18 (1) the date the person holding the permit is issued a license under

19 this article; or

20 (2) the date the committee disapproves the person's license

21 application.

22 (c) The committee may renew a temporary permit if the person

23 holding the permit was scheduled to take the next examination and:

24 (1) did not take the examination; and

25 (2) shows good cause for not taking the examination.

26 (d) A permit renewed under subsection (c) expires on the date the

27 person holding the permit receives the results from the next

28 examination given after the permit was issued.

29 SECTION 9. IC 25-34.5-2-12 IS REPEALED [EFFECTIVE JULY

30 1, 2026]. See: 12: (a) Examinations of applicants for licensure under

31 this article shall be held at least semiannually on dates set by the board.

32 (b) An examination under this section must include a written

33 examination that tests the following:

34 (1) The applicant's knowledge of the basic and clinical sciences

35 as they relate to the practice of respiratory care.

36 (2) Other subjects that the committee considers useful to test an

37 applicant's fitness to practice respiratory care.

38 (c) An otherwise qualified applicant who fails an examination and

1       is refused licensure may take another scheduled examination upon  
2       payment of an additional fee set by the board under rules adopted under  
3       section 7 of this chapter.

4       SECTION 10. IC 25-34.5-2-14, AS AMENDED BY P.L.152-2024,  
5       SECTION 8, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
6       JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 14. (a) The committee shall issue a student permit  
7       to an individual if the individual does the following:

8               (1) Submits the appropriate application to the committee.  
9               (2) Pays the fee established by the board.  
10               (3) Submits written proof to the committee that the individual is  
11       a student in good standing in a respiratory care school or program  
12       that: ~~has been~~:

13               (A) ~~has been~~ approved by the committee for purposes of  
14       section 8(b)(1) of this chapter;  
15               (B) ~~approved by the committee for purposes of section~~  
16       ~~10.1(a)(3)(B) is described in section 10.1(a)(3) of this~~  
17       chapter; or

18               (C) ~~has been~~ otherwise approved by the committee.  
19               (4) Submits satisfactory evidence that the individual:

20               (A) does not have a conviction described in section 8(a)(1) of  
21       this chapter; and  
22               (B) has not been the subject of a disciplinary action described  
23       in section 8(a)(2) of this chapter.

24               (b) The committee shall issue a student permit as soon as it is  
25       reasonably practicable after an individual fulfills the requirements of  
26       subsection (a).

27               (c) An individual who holds a student permit may only perform  
28       respiratory care procedures that have been part of a course:

29               (1) the individual has successfully completed in the respiratory  
30       care program designated under subsection (a)(3); and  
31               (2) for which the successful completion has been documented and  
32       that is available upon request to the committee.

33               (d) The committee may expand the list of respiratory care  
34       procedures that an individual may perform under the individual's  
35       student permit to include additional respiratory care procedures that  
36       have been part of a course:

37               (1) that the individual has successfully completed in the  
38       respiratory care program designated under subsection (a)(3); and

3       Upon request by the committee, the individual shall provide  
4       documentation of the successful completion of a course described in  
5       this subsection.

6 (e) The procedures permitted under subsections (c) and (d) may be  
7 performed only:

8 (1) on patients who are not critical care patients; and  
9 (2) under the proximate supervision of a practitioner.

10 (f) A holder of a student permit shall meet in person at least one (1)  
11 time each working day with the permit holder's supervising practitioner  
12 or a designated respiratory care practitioner to review the permit  
13 holder's clinical activities. The supervising practitioner or a designated  
14 respiratory care practitioner shall review and countersign the entries  
15 that the permit holder makes in a patient's medical record not more  
16 than seven (7) calendar days after the permit holder makes the entries.

17 (g) A supervising practitioner may not supervise at one (1) time  
18 more than three (3) holders of student permits issued under this section.

19 (h) A student permit expires on the earliest of the following:

20 (1) The date the permit holder is issued a license under this  
21 article.

(2) The date the committee disapproves the permit holder's application for a license under this article.

24 (3) The date the permit holder ceases to be a student in good  
25 standing in a respiratory care program approved by the  
26 committee. The graduation of a student permit holder from a  
27 respiratory care program approved by the committee does not  
28 cause the student permit to expire under this subdivision.

(4) Sixty (60) days after the date that the permit holder graduates from a respiratory care program approved by the committee.

- 1                   (5) The date that the permit holder is notified that the permit
- 2                   holder has failed the licensure examination.
- 3                   (6) Two (2) years after the date of issuance.".
