**Summary of Legislation:** This bill requires the Bureau of Motor Vehicles (BMV) to suspend or revoke the current driver's license or driving privileges of an individual who is convicted of a moving traffic offense that causes the death of a vulnerable road user.

**Effective Date:** July 1, 2026.

**Explanation of State Expenditures:** This bill could increase BMV workload to suspend driving privileges for individuals convicted of a moving offense resulting in death of a vulnerable road user. (Individuals who cause a fatality are not eligible for specialized driving privileges).

The bill's net impact on agency workload is expected to be accomplished within existing resource and funding levels.
