**Summary of Legislation:** The bill requires an employer to add, modify, or remove information in the youth employment system database within a certain time frame.

It repeals a chapter regarding the Residual Asbestos Injury Fund. The bill also transfers the balance of the funds remaining in the Residual Asbestos Injury Fund to the Worker's Compensation Supplemental Administrative Fund.

The bill removes provisions relating to a belt examiner certificate. It makes corresponding changes.

**Effective Date:** July 1, 2026.

**Explanation of State Expenditures:** *Fund Transfer:* The bill transfers the balance of the Residual Asbestos Injury Fund to the Worker's Compensation Supplemental Administrative Fund. As of June 30, 2025, the balance in the Residual Asbestos Injury Fund totaled \$701,737.

*Youth Employment:* The Department of Labor (DOL) enforces the state's child labor laws. The DOL would have additional workload to notify employers of the change in reporting requirements. The bill's requirements should be able to be implemented with no additional appropriations, assuming near customary agency staffing and resource levels.

**Additional Information** - The provisions related to a belt examiner certificate would have no fiscal impact. Indiana does not currently certify belt examiners.
