Summary of Legislation: This bill requires the Department of Education, in collaboration with the Indiana Department of Health, the Department of Child Services, and the Office of the Secretary of Family and Social Services to report and make recommendations concerning behavioral intervention services for children and special education.

Effective Date: July 1, 2026.

Explanation of State Expenditures: The following agencies will experience a one-time workload and/or expenditure impact in FY 2027 to prepare the report required under the bill:

- 1) The Department of Education (DOE);
- 2) The Indiana Department of Health;
- 3) The Department of Child Services; and
- 4) The Family and Social Services Administration

Expenditures could increase further if DOE contracts with a third party to prepare the report. The additional funds and resources required could be supplied through existing staff and resources currently being used in another program or with new appropriations. Ultimately, the source of funds and resources required to satisfy the requirements of this bill will depend on legislative and administrative actions.

Explanation of State Revenues:

Explanation of Local Expenditures: Public school workload will increase to provide the information required to complete the report. This is within a public school's routine administrative functions and should be able to be implemented with no additional appropriations, assuming near customary agency staffing and resource levels.
