HOUSE BILL No. 1342

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning elections.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 1-1-15.5-4, AS ADDED BY P.L.161-2025,
2 SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3 JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 4. (a) This section does not apply to:
4 (1) the governor's workforce cabinet established by IC 4-3-27-3;
5 (2) the budget committee established by IC 4-12-1-3;
6 (3) the simplified sales and use tax agreement entered into in
7 accordance with IC 6-2.5-11-5;
8 (4) the Indiana state board of education established by
9 IC 20-19-2-2.1;
10 (5) the Indiana School for the Blind and Visually Impaired board
11 established by IC 20-21-3-1;
12 (6) the Indiana School for the Deaf board established by
13 IC 20-22-3-1;
14 (7) a county redistricting commission established under
15 IC 36-2-2-4 **(before its expiration on January 1, 2031) or**

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IC 36-2-2-4.1 (after December 31, 2030);

(8) an economic enhancement district board established under IC 36-7-40-5; or

(9) the Indiana protection and advocacy services commission established by IC 12-28-1-6.

(b) On or before July 1, 2027, and July 1 biennially thereafter, a committee that:

(1) is established by the Indiana Code;

(2) contains at least one (1) member of the general assembly, other than a legislative standing committee or an interim study committee under IC 2-5;

(3) is authorized to exist for at least two (2) years; and

(4) does not have an annual reporting requirement, other than the requirements provided in this section, to the executive branch, judicial branch, or the general assembly;

shall submit a report to the executive director of the legislative services agency in an electronic format under IC 5-14-6 for review by the interim committee on government in accordance with IC 2-5-1.3-13(g).

(c) The report under subsection (b) shall describe:

(1) official action taken; and

(2) actionable items considered;

by the committee during the preceding two (2) years.

SECTION 2. IC 14-13-2-7, AS AMENDED BY P.L.104-2022, SECTION 91, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 7. (a) The commission has:

(1) before July 1, 2012, five (5) members appointed by the governor; and

(2) after June 30, 2012, nine (9) members appointed by the governor.

(b) The following requirements apply to the governor's appointments under subsection (a)(1):

(1) One (1) member must be a representative of the department of natural resources. The member may not be an employee or elected official of a city, town, or county governmental unit.

(2) The remaining four (4) members must meet the following requirements:

(A) Four (4) members must reside in a:

(i) city;

(ii) town; or

(iii) township (if the member resides in an unincorporated area of the county);

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that borders the Little Calumet River.

(B) At least three (3) of the members must have a background in:

(i) construction;

(ii) project management; or

(iii) flood control;

or a similar professional background.

(C) A member may not be an employee or elected official of a city, town, or county governmental unit.

(c) The following apply to the membership of the commission after June 30, 2012:

(1) Before August 1, 2012, the governor shall appoint four (4) additional members to the commission for four (4) year terms as follows:

(A) One (1) member nominated by the mayor of the city of Hammond.

(B) One (1) member nominated by the mayor of the city of Gary.

(C) Two (2) members nominated by the board of county commissioners of Lake County.

(2) Notwithstanding section 8 of this chapter, the term of the member described in subsection (b)(1) expires January 7, 2013. The governor shall appoint one (1) member nominated by the department of natural resources for a four (4) year term beginning January 7, 2013.

(3) Notwithstanding section 8 of this chapter, the terms of the members described in subsection (b)(2) expire January 1, 2014. The governor shall appoint for four (4) year terms beginning January 1, 2014, four (4) members, each of whom must have been nominated by the executive of a municipality located in the watershed other than a city described in subdivision (1).

(4) A member appointed to succeed a member appointed under subdivision (1) or (2) must be nominated by the nominating authority that nominated the member's predecessor, and a member appointed to succeed a member appointed under subdivision (3) must be nominated by the executive of a municipality located in the watershed other than a city described in subdivision (1).

(d) The following apply to a member appointed under subsection (c) and to any member appointed to succeed a member appointed under subsection (c):

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- 1 (1) After July 31, 2012, not more than five (5) members of the
 2 commission may belong to the same political party.
 3 (2) Each member must have a background in:
 4 (A) construction;
 5 (B) project management;
 6 (C) flood control; or
 7 (D) a similar professional background.
 8 (3) A member may not be an employee or elected official of a
 9 city, town, or county governmental unit.
 10 (4) The members:
 11 (A) appointed under subsection (c)(3); or
 12 (B) appointed to succeed members appointed under
 13 subsection (c)(3);
 14 must be from different municipalities.
 15 (5) Neither the two (2) members appointed under subsection
 16 (c)(1)(C) nor any two (2) members appointed to succeed them
 17 may be from the same district created under IC 36-2-2-4(b)
 18 **(before its expiration on January 1, 2031) or IC 36-2-2-4.1(c)**
 19 **(after December 31, 2030).**
 20 SECTION 3. IC 36-2-1-2, AS AMENDED BY P.L.104-2022,
 21 SECTION 145, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
 22 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 2. (a) If the resident voters in a
 23 specified territory in two (2) or more contiguous counties desire to
 24 change the boundaries of their respective counties, they may file a
 25 petition with the executives of their respective counties requesting that
 26 the territory be transferred. The petition must:
 27 (1) be signed by at least the number of voters resident in the
 28 territory requested to be transferred required to place a candidate
 29 on the ballot under IC 3-8-6-3;
 30 (2) contain a clear, distinct description of the requested boundary
 31 change; and
 32 (3) not propose to decrease the area of any county below four
 33 hundred (400) square miles in compliance with Article 15,
 34 Section 7 of the Constitution of the State of Indiana.
 35 (b) Whenever a petition under subsection (a) is filed with a county
 36 executive, the executive shall determine, at its first meeting after the
 37 petition is filed:
 38 (1) whether the signatures on the petition are genuine; and
 39 (2) whether the petition complies with subsection (a).
 40 (c) If the determinations under subsection (b) are affirmative, the
 41 executive shall certify the question to the county election board of each



1 affected county. The county election boards shall jointly order a special
 2 election to be held, scheduling the election so that the election is held
 3 on the same date in each county interested in the change, but not later
 4 than thirty (30) days and not on the same date as a general election. The
 5 election shall be conducted under IC 3-10-8-6. All voters of each
 6 interested county are entitled to vote on the question. The question
 7 shall be placed on the ballot in the form prescribed by IC 3-10-9-4 and
 8 must state "Shall the boundaries of _____ County and
 9 _____ County change?".

10 (d) After an election under subsection (c), the clerk of each county
 11 shall make a certified copy of the election returns and not later than
 12 five (5) days after the election file the copy with the auditor of the
 13 county. The auditor shall, not later than five (5) days after the filing of
 14 the returns in the auditor's office, make a true and complete copy of the
 15 returns, certified under the auditor's hand and seal, and deposit the copy
 16 with the auditor of every other county interested in the change.

17 (e) After copies have been filed under subsection (d), the auditor
 18 of each county shall call a meeting of the executive of the county,
 19 which shall examine the returns. If a majority of the voters of each
 20 interested county voted in favor of change, the executive shall:

21 (1) enter an order declaring their boundaries to be changed as
 22 described in the petition; and

23 (2) if the county has received territory from the transfer, adopt
 24 revised descriptions of:

25 (A) county commissioner districts under IC 36-2-2-4
 26 **(before its expiration on January 1, 2031) or**

28 (B) county council districts under IC 36-2-3-4;

29 so that the transferred territory is assigned to at least one (1) county
 30 commissioner district and at least one (1) county council district.

 32 described in subsection (e)(1) with:

33 (1) the office of the secretary of state; and

34 (2) the circuit court clerk of the county.

35 The transfer of territory becomes effective when the last county order
 36 is filed under this subsection.

37 (g) An election under this section may be held only once every
 38 three (3) years.

39 SECTION 4. IC 36-2-2-4, AS AMENDED BY P.L.230-2025,
 40 SECTION 139, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
 41 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 4. (a) This subsection does not



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1 apply to the following counties:

2 (1) A county having a population of more than four hundred fifty
3 thousand (450,000) and less than seven hundred thousand
4 (700,000).

5 (2) A county having a population of more than one hundred
6 eighty-five thousand (185,000) and less than three hundred
7 thousand (300,000).

8 The executive shall divide the county into three (3) districts that are
9 composed of contiguous territory and are reasonably compact. The
10 district boundaries drawn by the executive must not cross precinct
11 boundary lines and must divide townships only when a division is
12 clearly necessary to accomplish redistricting under this section. If
13 necessary, the county auditor shall call a special meeting of the

41 executive shall divide the county into three (3) single-member districts

 36 1, 2026]: **Sec. 4.1. (a) This section applies after December 31, 2030.**
 37 **(b) This subsection does not apply to a county having a**
 38 **population of more than four hundred fifty thousand (450,000) and**
 39 **less than seven hundred thousand (700,000), or a county having a**
 40 **population of more than one hundred eighty-five thousand**
 41 **(185,000) and less than three hundred thousand (300,000). The**
 42 **executive shall adopt an ordinance to divide the county into three**



(3) districts. The following apply to districts established or revised under this subsection:

(1) The executive shall:

(A) publish proposed district boundaries; and

(B) hold a public hearing concerning proposed district boundaries;

before adopting an ordinance to establish or revise districts.

(2) Districts must be:

(A) composed of contiguous territory; and

(B) reasonably compact.

(c) This subsection applies to a county having a population of more than four hundred fifty thousand (450,000) and less than seven hundred thousand (700,000). A county redistricting commission shall divide the county into three (3) single-member districts that comply with subsection (e). The commission is composed of:

(1) the members of the Indiana election commission;

(2) two (2) members of the senate selected by the president pro tempore, one (1) from each political party; and

(3) two (2) members of the house of representatives selected by the speaker, one (1) from each political party.

The legislative members of the commission have no vote and may act only in an advisory capacity. A majority vote of the voting members is required for the commission to take action. The commission may meet as frequently as necessary to perform its duty under this subsection. The commission's members serve without additional compensation above that provided for them as members of the Indiana election commission, the senate, or the house of representatives.

(d) This subsection applies to a county having a population of more than one hundred eighty-five thousand (185,000) and less than three hundred thousand (300,000) that opts in to the system of county government described in subsection (e), sections 4.7(c) and 5(d)(2) of this chapter, IC 36-2-3-2(b), IC 36-2-3-4(c), and



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1 IC 36-2-3.5-1(2) by passing a resolution by a majority vote of its
 2 executive body not later than September 1, 2023. In the event the
 3 executive body of a county described in this subsection does not opt
 4 in by September 1, 2023, the county shall be governed by the
 5 general provisions of this chapter. The executive shall divide the
 6 county into three (3) single-member districts that comply with
 7 subsection (e).

8 (e) Single-member districts established under subsection (c) or
 9 (d) must:

10 (1) be compact, subject only to natural boundary lines (such

 23 Constitution of the State of Indiana; and

24 (2) the district from which the member was elected.

5 council elected under this chapter is the county fiscal body. The fiscal
6 body shall act in the name of "The _____ County Council".

7 (b) Notwithstanding subsection (a), in a county having a
8 population of more than one hundred eighty-five thousand (185,000)
9 and less than three hundred thousand (300,000) that opts in to the
10 system of county government as described in IC 36-2-2-4(c) **(before its**
11 **expiration on January 1, 2031) or IC 36-2-2-4.1(d) (after December**
12 **31, 2030)**, the county council has nine (9) members.

15 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 4. (a) This subsection does not
16 apply to the following counties:

17 (1) A county having a population of more than four hundred
18 thousand (400,000) and less than seven hundred thousand
19 (700,000).

20 (2) A county having a population of more than one hundred
21 eighty-five thousand (185,000) and less than three hundred
22 thousand (300,000) that opts in to the system of county
23 government as described in IC 36-2-2-4(c) **(before its**
24 **expiration on January 1, 2031) or IC 36-2-2-4.1(d) (after**
25 **December 31, 2030)**.

26 The county executive shall, by ordinance, divide the county into four
27 (4) single-member districts that comply with subsection (d). If
28 necessary, the county auditor shall call a special meeting of the
29 executive to establish or revise districts. One (1) member of the fiscal

31 Three (3) at-large members of the fiscal body shall be elected by the

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more than one hundred eighty-five thousand (185,000) and less than three hundred thousand (300,000) that opts in to the system of county government described in IC 36-2-2-4(c) **(before its expiration on January 1, 2031) or IC 36-2-2-4.1(d) (after December 31, 2030).**

The fiscal body shall divide the county into nine (9) single-member districts that comply with subsection (d). Three (3) of these districts must be contained within each of the three (3) districts established under IC 36-2-2-4(c) **(before its expiration on January 1, 2031) or IC 36-2-2-4.1(d) (after December 31, 2030).** One (1) member of the fiscal body shall be elected by the voters of each of these nine (9) single-member districts.

(d) Single-member districts established under subsection (a), (b), or (c) must:

- (1) be compact and be composed of contiguous territory, subject only to natural boundary lines (such as railroads, major highways, rivers, creeks, parks, and major industrial complexes);
- (2) not cross precinct boundary lines;
- (3) contain, as nearly as possible, equal population; and
- (4) include whole townships, except when a division is clearly necessary to accomplish redistricting under this section.

(e) Except as provided by subsection (f), a division under subsection (a), (b), or (c) shall be made only at times permitted under IC 3-5-10.

(f) If the county executive, county redistricting commission, or county fiscal body determines that a division under subsection (e) is not required, the county executive, county redistricting commission, or county fiscal body shall adopt an ordinance recertifying that the districts as drawn comply with this section.

(g) Each time there is a division under subsection (e) or a recertification under subsection (f), the county executive, county redistricting commission, or county fiscal body shall file with the circuit court clerk of the county, not later than thirty (30) days after the division or recertification occurs, a map of the district boundaries:

- (1) adopted under subsection (e); or
- (2) recertified under subsection (f).

(h) The limitations set forth in this section are part of the ordinance, but do not have to be specifically set forth in the ordinance. The ordinance must be construed, if possible, to comply with this chapter. If a provision of the ordinance or an application of the ordinance violates this chapter, the invalidity does not affect the other provisions or applications of the ordinance that can be given effect

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without the invalid provision or application. The provisions of the ordinance are severable.

(i) IC 3-5-10 applies to a plan established under this section.

SECTION 10. IC 36-2-3.5-1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.230-2025, SECTION 141, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 1. This chapter applies to the following counties:

(1) A county having a population of more than four hundred fifty thousand (450,000) and less than seven hundred thousand (700,000).

(2) A county having a population of more than one hundred eighty-five thousand (185,000) and less than three hundred thousand (300,000) that opts in to the system of county government as described in IC 36-2-2-4(c) **(before its expiration on January 1, 2031) or IC 36-2-2-4.1(d) (after December 31, 2030).**

(3) Any other county not having a consolidated city, if both the county executive and the county fiscal body adopt identical ordinances providing for the county to be governed by this chapter beginning on a specified effective date.

SECTION 11. IC 36-2-3.5-6 IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 6. (a) A court may issue an order, before final hearing, to stay an election if there is sufficient evidence to withstand a motion for summary judgment that the county has not been divided into districts that comply with IC 36-2-2-4 **(before its expiration on January 1, 2031), IC 36-2-2-4.1(d) (after December 31, 2030),** or IC 36-2-3-4. A preliminary hearing on the question may be held upon the court's own motion.

(b) Final judgment on the merits in such a case shall be made within thirty (30) days of the stay of election order. If the redistricting is found not to be in compliance with law, the court shall retain jurisdiction and shall order the proper officials to submit within thirty (30) days a redistricting plan complying with law. If the proper officials fail to comply with the order, the court shall order the Indiana election commission to divide the county into districts in compliance with law.

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
