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## HOUSE BILL No. 1344

Proposed Changes to introduced printing by AM134403

### DIGEST OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Fees. Provides for a prosecuting attorney compensation fee of \$10 for certain actions and \$50 for certain actions. (The current bill provides for a fee of \$40 for all actions.)

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning courts and court officers.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

3 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 1. (a) The following fees and costs  
4 apply to cases in the small claims court:  
5 (1) A township docket fee of five dollars (\$5) plus forty-five  
6 percent (45%) of the infraction or ordinance violation costs fee  
7 under IC 33-37-4-2.  
8 (2) The bailiff's service of process by registered or certified mail  
9 fee of fifteen dollars (\$15) for each service.  
10 (3) The cost for the personal service of process by the bailiff or  
11 other process server of fifteen dollars (\$15) for each service.  
12 (4) Witness fees, if any, in the amount provided by  
13 IC 33-37-10-3 to be taxed and charged in the circuit court.  
14 (5) A redocketing fee, if any, of five dollars (\$5).  
15 (6) A document storage fee under IC 33-37-5-20.  
16 (7) An automated record keeping fee under IC 33-37-5-21.  
17 (8) A late fee, if any, under IC 33-37-5-22.  
18 (9) A public defense administration fee under IC 33-37-5-21.2.  
19 (10) A judicial insurance adjustment fee under IC 33-37-5-25.  
20 (11) A judicial salaries fee under IC 33-37-5-26.

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- 1 (12) A court administration fee under IC 33-37-5-27.
- 2 (13) A pro bono legal services fee under IC 33-37-5-31.
- 3 (14) A sheriff's service of process fee under IC 33-37-5-15 for
- 4 each service of process performed outside Marion County.
- 5 (15) A small claims service fee of twenty-six dollars (\$26) under
- 6 IC 33-37-5-35.
- 7 **(16) A prosecuting attorney compensation fee under**

9 The township docket fee and the cost for the initial service of process  
10 shall be paid at the institution of a case. The cost of service after the  
11 initial service shall be assessed and paid after service has been made.  
12 The cost of witness fees shall be paid before the witnesses are called.

37 The auditor or fiscal officer shall deposit fees transferred under this  
 38 subsection in the appropriate user fee fund established under

40 (e) Unless otherwise directed by a court, if a clerk collects only  
 41 part of a criminal costs fee from a defendant under this section, the  
 42 clerk shall distribute the partial payment of the criminal costs fee as

2 (1) The clerk shall apply the partial payment to general court  
 3 costs.  
 4 (2) If there is money remaining after the partial payment is  
 5 applied to general court costs under subdivision (1), the clerk  
 6 shall distribute the remainder of the partial payment for deposit  
 7 in the appropriate county user fee fund.  
 8 (3) If there is money remaining after distribution under  
 9 subdivision (2), the clerk shall distribute the remainder of the  
 10 partial payment for deposit in the state user fee fund.

 13 partial payment to any other applicable user fee fund.
