## **SENATE BILL No. 18**

#### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 20-23-17.2.

**Synopsis:** East Chicago school board elections. Changes the election process for the governing body of the East Chicago school corporation, so that all members are elected at large by the voters of the school corporation. (Current law provides that three members are elected from certain districts, and two members are elected at large.) Makes conforming changes.

Effective: July 1, 2026.

### SENATE BILL No. 18

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1	SECTION 1. IC 20-23-17.2-3.1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.195-2025.
2	SECTION 35, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3	JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 3.1. (a) The governing body of the school
4	corporation consists of five (5) members, elected as provided in this
5	chapter.
6	(b) Three (3) members shall be elected as follows:
7	(1) From districts established as provided in section 4.1 of this
8	chapter. At large by all the voters of the school corporation.
9	(2) At the general election held in the county in 2026, 2030, 2034,
0	2038, 2042, and every four (4) years thereafter.
1	(c) Two (2) members shall be elected as follows:
2	(1) At large by all the voters of the school corporation.
3	(2) At the general election held in the county in 2028, 2032, 2036,
4	2040, 2044, and every four (4) years thereafter.
5	(d) The term of office of a member of the governing body:
6	(1) is four (4) years; and
7	(2) begins January 1 after the election of members of the



1	governing body.
2	(e) Upon assuming office and in conducting the business of the
3	governing body, a member shall represent the interests of the entire
4	school corporation.
5	SECTION 2. IC 20-23-17.2-4.1 IS REPEALED [EFFECTIVE JULY
6	1, 2026]. Sec. 4.1. (a) As used in this section, "council district" refers
7	to a district of the city legislative body:
8	(1) established under IC 36-4-6-3; and
9	(2) as in effect on January 1, 2015.
0	(b) The districts from which a member of the governing body is
1	elected under section 3.1(b) of this chapter are as follows:
2	(1) School corporation district 1 consists of the territory formed
3	by council district 1 and council district 2.
4	(2) School corporation district 2 consists of the territory formed
5	by council district 3 and council district 4.
6	(3) School corporation district 3 consists of the territory formed
7	by council district 5 and council district 6.
8	SECTION 3. IC 20-23-17.2-5, AS AMENDED BY P.L.195-2025,
9	SECTION 36, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
20	JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 5. (a) The following apply to an election of
21	members of the governing body of the school corporation under section
22	3.1(b) of this chapter:
23	(1) Each candidate must file a petition of nomination with the
.4	circuit court clerk not earlier than one hundred four (104) days
25	and not later than seventy-four (74) days before the general
26	election at which members are to be elected. The petition of
27	nomination must include the following information:
28	(A) The name of the candidate.
.9	(B) The candidate's residence address and the district in which
0	the candidate resides.
1	(C) The signatures of at least twenty (20) registered voters
2	residing within the school corporation district the candidate
3	seeks to represent.
4	(D) A certification that the candidate meets the qualifications
5	for candidacy imposed by this chapter.

8	(2) Only eligible voters residing in the school corporation district
9	as provided in section 4.1 of this chapter may vote for a candidate
0	to represent that school corporation district.

-2	district provided by section 4.1 of this chapter. The candidate



1	elected for a school corporation district must reside within the

3	elected as the member for a particular school corporation district
4	is the candidate who, among all the candidates who reside within
5	that school corporation district, receives the greatest number of
6	votes from voters residing in that school corporation district.
7	(b) (a) The following apply to an election of the members of the
8	governing body of the school corporation under section 3.1(c) 3.1 of
9	this chapter:
10	(1) Each candidate must file a petition of nomination with the
11	circuit court clerk not earlier than one hundred four (104) days
12	and not later than seventy-four (74) days before the general
13	election at which members are to be elected. The petition of
14	nomination must include the following information:

16	(B) The candidate's residence address.
17	(C) The signatures of at least one hundred (100) registered

23	(2) Only eligible voters residing in the school corporation may

27	who receive the greatest number of votes among all candidates
28	running for an at-large seat are elected as members of the
29	governing body.
30	(4) At an election held under section 3.1(b) of this chapter,
31	three (3) candidates shall be elected at large. The three (3)
32	candidates who receive the greatest number of votes among
33	all candidates running for an at-large seat are elected as
34	members of the governing body.
35	(c) (b) The following apply to a petition of nomination required
36	under subsections subsection (a)(1): and (b)(1):
37	(1) The petition must:

9	JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 6. (a) Voters who reside within the boundaries of
10	the school corporation may vote for the candidates elected under
11	section 3.1 of this chapter.
12	(b) At an election held under section 3.1(b) of this chapter, each
13	voter may vote only for three (3) at-large candidates. the following:
14	(1) One (1) candidate to represent the district in which the voter

16	(2) Two (2) at-large candidates.
17	(c) At an election held under section 3.1(c) of this chapter, each
18	voter may vote only for two (2) at-large candidates.
