DIGEST OF SB 25 (Updated January 27, 2026 9:32 am - DI 149)

Citations Affected: IC 3-11.

Synopsis: School board candidates. Specifies that if there is more than one candidate for a school board office within certain designated groups of candidates, the candidates shall appear in a certain order and within the grouping and in alphabetical order according to surname.

Effective: Upon passage.

SENATE BILL No. 25

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning elections.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 3-11-2-6, AS AMENDED BY P.L.11-2023,
2 SECTION 8, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3 UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 6. (a) The device named and list of nominees
4 shall be placed on the ballots as follows:

5 (1) The major political party whose candidate received the highest
6 number of votes in the county for secretary of state at the last
7 election in the first column or row on the left side of all ballots.
8 (2) The major political party whose candidate received the second
9 highest number of votes in the county for secretary of state at the
10 last election in the second column or row.
11 (3) Any other political party in the same order.

12 (b) If a political party did not have a candidate for secretary of state
13 in the last election or a nominee is an independent candidate (or an
14 independent ticket for President and Vice President of the United
15 States or for governor and lieutenant governor), the party or
16 independent candidate or ticket shall be placed on the ballot after the
17 parties described in subsection (a). If more than one (1) political party

1 or independent candidate or ticket that has qualified to be on the ballot
2 did not have a candidate for secretary of state in the last election, those
3 parties, candidates, or tickets shall be listed on the ballot in the order
4 in which the party filed its petition of nomination under IC 3-8-6-12.

5 (c) Subject to subsection (e), a column or row for write-in voting
6 shall be placed to the right of all party and independent columns on the
7 ballot.

8 (d) This subsection applies to a county having a population of more
9 than four hundred thousand (400,000) and less than seven hundred
10 thousand (700,000). If there is insufficient room on a row to list each
11 candidate of a political party, a second or subsequent row may be
12 utilized. However, a second or subsequent row may not be utilized
13 unless the first row, and all preceding rows, have been filled.

14 (e) A column or row for write-in voting for an office is not required
15 if there are no declared write-in candidates for that office. However,
16 procedures must be implemented to permit write-in voting for
17 candidates for federal offices.

18 (f) **This subsection applies to candidates who appear on the
19 ballot for a school board office. The names of the candidates for
20 each office must be grouped together in the following order:**

21 (1) **The major political party whose candidate received the
22 highest number of votes in the county for secretary of state at
23 the last election is listed first.**

24 (2) **The major political party whose candidate received the
25 second highest number of votes in the county for secretary of
26 state is listed second.**

27 (3) **All other political parties listed in the order that the
28 parties' candidates for secretary of state finished in the last
29 election are listed after the party listed in subdivision (2).**

30 (4) **If a political party did not have a candidate for secretary
31 of state in the last election or a nominee is an independent
32 candidate, the party or candidate is listed after the parties
33 described in subdivisions (1), (2), and (3).**

34 (5) **If more than one (1) political party or independent
35 candidate qualifies to be on the ballot, the parties, candidates,
36 or tickets are listed in the order in which the party filed its
37 petition of nomination under IC 3-8-6-12.**

38 (6) **The name of a candidate described in
39 IC 3-8-2.5-2.5(a)(5)(C) is placed after the candidates listed in
40 subdivisions (1) through (5), if applicable.**

41 (7) **A space for write-in voting is placed after the candidates
42 listed in subdivisions (1) through (6), if required by law.**



(8) The name of a write-in candidate may not be listed on the ballot.

If there is more than one (1) candidate for a grouping described in subdivisions (1) through (8) for a school board office, the candidates shall appear in the order established by this subsection and within the grouping, in alphabetical order according to surname.

SECTION 2. IC 3-11-13-11, AS AMENDED BY THE TECHNICAL CORRECTIONS BILL OF THE 2026 GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 11. (a) The ballot information, whether placed on the ballot card or on the marking device, must be in the order of arrangement provided for ballots under this section.

(b) Each county election board shall have the names of all candidates for all elected offices, political party offices, and public questions printed on a ballot card as provided in this chapter. The county may:

- (1) print all offices and questions on a single ballot card; and
- (2) include a ballot variation code to ensure that the proper version of a ballot is used within a precinct.

(c) Each type of ballot card must be of uniform size and of the same quality and color of paper (except as permitted under IC 3-10-1-17).

(d) The nominees of a political party or an independent candidate or independent ticket (described in IC 3-11-2-6) nominated by petitioners shall be listed on the ballot with the name and device set forth on the certification or petition. The circle containing the device may be of any size that permits a voter to readily identify the device. IC 3-11-2-5 applies if the certification or petition does not include a name or device, or if the same device is selected by two (2) or more parties or petitioners. In the case of a candidate described in IC 3-8-2.5-2.5(a)(5)(C), a blank space **must be printed** after the candidate's name signifying that the candidate elects not to disclose any affiliation with a political party or that the candidate:

- (1) is not affiliated with a political party; and
- (2) does not identify as an independent candidate.

(e) The offices and public questions on the general election ballot must be placed on the ballot in the order listed in IC 3-11-2-12, IC 3-11-2-12.4, IC 3-11-2-12.5, IC 3-11-2-12.7(b), IC 3-11-2-12.9(a), IC 3-11-2-12.9(c), IC 3-11-2-13(a) through IC 3-11-2-13(c), IC 3-11-2-14(a), IC 3-11-2-14(d), and IC 3-11-2-14(e). The offices and public questions may be listed in a continuous column either vertically or horizontally and on a number of separate pages.



5 (1) "Vote for one (1) only.", if only one (1) candidate is to be
6 elected to the office.

7 (2) "Vote for not more than (insert the number of candidates to be
8 elected) candidate(s) for this office. To vote for any candidate for
9 this office, you must make a voting mark for each candidate you
10 wish to vote for. A straight party vote will not count as a vote for
11 any candidate for this office.", if more than one (1) candidate is to
12 be elected to the office.

16 (g) Below the name of the office and the statement required by
17 subsection (f), the names of the candidates for each office must be
18 grouped together in the following order:

19 (1) The major political party whose candidate received the highest
20 number of votes in the county for secretary of state at the last
21 election is listed first.

22 (2) The major political party whose candidate received the second
23 highest number of votes in the county for secretary of state is
24 listed second.

25 (3) All other political parties listed in the order that the parties'
26 candidates for secretary of state finished in the last election are
27 listed after the party listed in subdivision (2).

28 (4) If a political party did not have a candidate for secretary of
29 state in the last election or a nominee is an independent candidate
30 or independent ticket (described in IC 3-11-2-6), the party or

candidate is listed after the parties described in subdivisions (1), (2), and (3).
(5) If more than one (1) political party or independent candidate or ticket described in subdivision (4) qualifies to be on the ballot, the parties, candidates, or tickets are listed in the order in which the party filed its petition of nomination under IC 3-8-6-12.

37 (6) The name of a candidate described in IC 3-8-2.5-2.5(a)(5)(C)
38 is placed after the candidates listed in subdivisions (1) through
39 (5), if applicable.

(7) A space for write-in voting is placed after the candidates listed in subdivisions (1) through (6), if required by law.

42 (8) The name of a write-in candidate may not be listed on the



1 ballot.

If there is more than one (1) candidate for a grouping described in subdivisions (1) through (8) for a school board office, the candidates shall appear in the order established by this subsection and within the grouping, in alphabetical order according to surname.

7 (h) The names of the candidates grouped in the order established by
8 subsection (g) must be printed in type with uniform capital letters and
9 have a uniform space between each name. The name of the candidate's
10 political party, or the word "Independent" if the:

11 (1) candidate; or

12 (2) ticket of candidates for:

13 (A) President and Vice President of the United States; or

14 (B) governor and lieutenant governor;

15 is independent, must be placed immediately below or beside the name
16 of the candidate and must be printed in a uniform size and type. In the
17 case of a candidate described in IC 3-8-2.5-2.5(a)(5)(C), the name of
18 the candidate must be printed with a blank space after the candidate's
19 name signifying that the candidate elects not to disclose any affiliation
20 with a political party or that the candidate is not affiliated with a
21 political party and does not identify as an independent candidate.

22 (i) All the candidates of the same political party for election to
23 at-large seats on the fiscal or legislative body of a political subdivision
24 must be grouped together:

25 (1) under the name of the office that the candidates are seeking;
26 (2) in the order established by subsection (g); and
27 (3) within the political party, in alphabetical order according to
28 surname.

29 A statement reading substantially as follows must be placed
30 immediately below the name of the office and above the name of the
31 first candidate: "Vote for not more than (insert the number of
32 candidates to be elected) candidate(s) of ANY party for this office.".

33 (j) Candidates for election to at-large seats on the governing body
34 of a school corporation must be grouped:

35 (1) under the name of the office that the candidates are seeking;
36 and

37 (2) in alphabetical order according to surname.
38 A statement reading substantially as follows must be placed
39 immediately below the name of the office and above the name of the
40 first candidate: "Vote for not more than (insert the number of
41 candidates to be elected) candidate(s) for this office. A straight party
42 vote will not count as a vote for any candidate for this office.".



3 (1) The cautionary statement described in IC 3-11-2-7.

6 (I) The ballot must include a single connectable arrow, circle, oval,
7 or square, or a voting position for voting a straight party ticket by one
8 (1) mark as required by section 14 of this chapter, and the single
9 connectable arrow, circle, oval, or square, or the voting position for
10 casting a straight party ticket ballot must be identified by:

11 (1) the name of the political party; and

12 (2) immediately below or beside the political party's name, the
13 device of that party (described in IC 3-11-2-5).

14 The name and device of each political party must be of uniform size
15 and type and arranged in the order established by subsection (g) for
16 listing candidates under each office. The instructions described in
17 IC 3-11-2-10(c) for voting a straight party ticket and the statement
18 concerning presidential electors required under IC 3-10-4-3 must be
19 placed on the ballot label. The instructions for voting a straight party
20 ticket must include the statement: "If you do not wish to vote a straight
21 party ticket, do not make a mark in this section and proceed to voting
22 the ballot by office.".

23 (m) A public question must be in the form described in
24 IC 3-11-2-15(a) and IC 3-11-2-15(b), except that a single connectable
25 arrow, a circle, or an oval may be used instead of a square. Except as
26 expressly authorized or required by statute, a county election board
27 may not print a ballot card that contains language concerning the public
28 question other than the language authorized by a statute.

29 (n) The requirements in this section:

30 (1) do not replace; and
31 (2) are in addition to;

any other requirements in this title that apply to optical scan ballots.

37 (p) This subsection applies to an optical scan ballot that does not
38 list:

39 (1) the names of political parties or candidates; or
40 (2) the text of public questions;

on the face of the ballot. The ballot must be prepared in accordance with this section, except that the ballot must include a numbered circle



1 or oval to refer to each political party, candidate, or public question.

2 SECTION 3. IC 3-11-14-3.5, AS AMENDED BY THE
3 TECHNICAL CORRECTIONS BILL OF THE 2026 GENERAL
4 ASSEMBLY, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
5 UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 3.5. (a) Each county election board shall have
6 the names of all candidates for all elected offices, political party
7 offices, and public questions printed on ballot labels for use in an
8 electronic voting system as provided in this chapter.

9 (b) The county may:

10 (1) print all offices and public questions on a single ballot label;
11 and
12 (2) include a ballot variation code to ensure that the proper
13 version of a ballot label is used within a precinct.

14 (c) Each type of ballot label must be of uniform size and of the same
15 quality and color of paper (except as permitted under IC 3-10-1-17).

16 (d) The nominees of a political party or an independent candidate
17 or independent ticket (described in IC 3-11-2-6) nominated by
18 petitioners must be listed on the ballot label with the name and device
19 set forth on the certification or petition. The circle containing the
20 device may be of any size that permits a voter to readily identify the
21 device. IC 3-11-2-5 applies if the certification or petition does not
22 include a name or device, or if the same device is selected by two (2)
23 or more parties or petitioners. In the case of a candidate described in
24 IC 3-8-2.5-2.5(a)(5)(C), a blank space **must be printed** after the
25 candidate's name signifying that the candidate elects not to disclose any
26 affiliation with a political party or that the candidate:

27 (1) is not affiliated with a political party; and
28 (2) does not identify as an independent candidate.

29 (e) The ballot labels must list the offices and public questions on the
30 general election ballot in the order listed in IC 3-11-2-12,
31 IC 3-11-2-12.4, IC 3-11-2-12.5, IC 3-11-2-12.7(b), IC 3-11-2-12.9(a),
32 IC 3-11-2-12.9(c), IC 3-11-2-13(a) through IC 3-11-2-13(c),
33 IC 3-11-2-14(a), IC 3-11-2-14(d), and IC 3-11-2-14(e). Each office and
34 public question may have a separate screen, or the offices and public
35 questions may be listed in a continuous column either vertically or
36 horizontally.

37 (f) The name of each office must be printed in a uniform size in bold
38 type. A statement reading substantially as follows must be placed
39 immediately below the name of the office and above the name of the
40 first candidate:

41 (1) "Vote for one (1) only.", if only one (1) candidate is to be
42 elected to the office.



(2) "Vote for not more than (insert the number of candidates to be elected) candidate(s) for this office. To vote for any candidate for this office, you must make a voting mark for each candidate you wish to vote for. A straight party vote will not count as a vote for any candidate for this office.", if more than one (1) candidate is to be elected to the office.

(3) "Vote for one (1) only. A straight party vote will not count as a vote for any candidate for this office.", if only one (1) candidate is to be elected to a school board office.

(g) Below the name of the office and the statement required by subsection (f), the names of the candidates for each office must be grouped together in the following order:

(1) The major political party whose candidate received the highest number of votes in the county for secretary of state at the last election is listed first.

(2) The major political party whose candidate received the second highest number of votes in the county for secretary of state is listed second.

(3) All other political parties listed in the order that the parties' candidates for secretary of state finished in the last election are listed after the party listed in subdivision (2).

(4) If a political party did not have a candidate for secretary of state in the last election or a nominee is an independent candidate or independent ticket (described in IC 3-11-2-6), the party or candidate is listed after the parties described in subdivisions (1), (2), and (3).

(5) If more than one (1) political party or independent candidate or ticket described in subdivision (4) qualifies to be on the ballot, the parties, candidates, or tickets are listed in the order in which the party filed its petition of nomination under IC 3-8-6-12.

(6) The name of a candidate described in IC 3-8-2.5-2.5(a)(5)(C) is placed after the candidates listed in subdivisions (1) through (5), if applicable.

(7) A space for write-in voting is placed after the candidates listed in subdivisions (1) through (6), if required by law. A space for write-in voting for an office is not required if there are no declared write-in candidates for that office. However, procedures may be adopted to permit write-in voting for candidates for

(8) The name of a write-in candidate may not be listed on the ballot.

5 (h) The names of the candidates grouped in the order established by

11 (A) President and Vice President of the United States; or
12 (B) governor and lieutenant governor;

13 is independent, must be placed immediately below or beside the name
14 of the candidate and must be printed in uniform size and type. In the
15 case of a candidate described in IC 3-8-2.5-2.5(a)(5)(C), the name of
16 the candidate must be printed with a blank space after the candidate's
17 name signifying that the candidate elects not to disclose any affiliation
18 with a political party or that the candidate is not affiliated with a
19 political party and does not identify as an independent candidate.

20 (i) All the candidates of the same political party for election to
21 at-large seats on the fiscal or legislative body of a political subdivision
22 must be grouped together:

23 (1) under the name of the office that the candidates are seeking;
24 (2) in the party order established by subsection (g); and
25 (3) within the political party, in alphabetical order according to
26 surname.

27 A statement reading substantially as follows must be placed
28 immediately below the name of the office and above the name of the
29 first candidate: "Vote for not more than (insert the number of
30 candidates to be elected) candidate(s) of ANY party for this office.".

31 (j) Candidates for election to at-large seats on the governing body
32 of a school corporation must be grouped:

33 (1) under the name of the office that the candidates are seeking;
34 and
35 (2) in alphabetical order according to surname.

36 A statement reading substantially as follows must be placed
37 immediately below the name of the office and above the name of the
38 first candidate: "Vote for not more than (insert the number of
39 candidates to be elected) candidate(s) for this office. A straight party
40 vote will not count as a vote for any candidate for this office.".

41 (k) The cautionary statement described in IC 3-11-2-7 must be
42 placed at the top or beginning of the ballot label before the first public



1 question is listed.

2 (l) The instructions described in IC 3-11-2-8, IC 3-11-2-10(d), and
3 IC 3-11-2-10(e) may be:

4 (1) placed on the ballot label; or

5 (2) posted in a location within the voting booth that permits the
6 voter to easily read the instructions.

7 (m) Except as provided in section 14.5 of this chapter, the ballot
8 label must include a touch sensitive point or button for voting a straight
9 political party ticket by one (1) touch, and the touch sensitive point or
10 button must be identified by:

11 (1) the name of the political party; and

12 (2) immediately below or beside the political party's name, the
13 device of that party (described in IC 3-11-2-5).

14 The name and device of each party must be of uniform size and type,
15 and arranged in the order established by subsection (g) for listing
16 candidates under each office. The instructions described in
17 IC 3-11-2-10(c) for voting a straight party ticket and the statement
18 concerning presidential electors required under IC 3-10-4-3 must be
19 placed on the ballot label. The instructions for voting a straight party
20 ticket must include the statement: "If you do not wish to vote a straight
21 party ticket, press "NEXT" (or replace "NEXT" with the term used by
22 that voting system to permit a voter to skip a ballot screen) to continue
23 voting.".

24 (n) A public question must be in the form described in
25 IC 3-11-2-15(a) and IC 3-11-2-15(b), except that a touch sensitive
26 point or button must be used instead of a square. Except as expressly
27 authorized or required by statute, a county election board may not print
28 a ballot label that contains language concerning the public question
29 other than the language authorized by a statute.

30 (o) The requirements in this section:

31 (1) do not replace; and

32 (2) are in addition to;

33 any other requirements in this title that apply to ballots for electronic
34 voting systems.

35 (p) The procedure described in IC 3-11-2-16 must be used when a
36 ballot label does not comply with the requirements imposed by this title
37 or contains another error or omission that might result in confusion or
38 mistakes by voters.

39 **SECTION 4. An emergency is declared for this act.**
