

COMMITTEE REPORT

MR. PRESIDENT:

The Senate Committee on Rules and Legislative Procedure, to which was referred Senate Bill No. 25, has had the same under consideration and begs leave to report the same back to the Senate with the recommendation that said bill be AMENDED as follows:

1 Delete everything after the enacting clause and insert the
2 following:

3 SECTION 1. IC 3-11-2-6, AS AMENDED BY P.L.11-2023,
4 SECTION 8, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
5 UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 6. (a) The device named and list of nominees
6 shall be placed on the ballots as follows:

7 (1) The major political party whose candidate received the
8 highest number of votes in the county for secretary of state at the
9 last election in the first column or row on the left side of all
10 ballots.

11 (2) The major political party whose candidate received the
12 second highest number of votes in the county for secretary of
13 state at the last election in the second column or row.

14 (3) Any other political party in the same order.

15 (b) If a political party did not have a candidate for secretary of
16 state in the last election or a nominee is an independent candidate (or
17 an independent ticket for President and Vice President of the United
18 States or for governor and lieutenant governor), the party or
19 independent candidate or ticket shall be placed on the ballot after the
20 parties described in subsection (a). If more than one (1) political party
21 or independent candidate or ticket that has qualified to be on the ballot
22 did not have a candidate for secretary of state in the last election, those
23 parties, candidates, or tickets shall be listed on the ballot in the order
24 in which the party filed its petition of nomination under IC 3-8-6-12.

25 (c) Subject to subsection (e), a column or row for write-in voting
26 shall be placed to the right of all party and independent columns on the

1 ballot.

2 (d) This subsection applies to a county having a population of
 3 more than four hundred thousand (400,000) and less than seven
 4 hundred thousand (700,000). If there is insufficient room on a row to
 5 list each candidate of a political party, a second or subsequent row may
 6 be utilized. However, a second or subsequent row may not be utilized
 7 unless the first row, and all preceding rows, have been filled.

8 (e) A column or row for write-in voting for an office is not
 9 required if there are no declared write-in candidates for that office.
 10 However, procedures must be implemented to permit write-in voting
 11 for candidates for federal offices.

12 (f) **This subsection applies to candidates who appear on the
 13 ballot for a school board office. The names of the candidates for
 14 each office must be grouped together in the following order:**

15 (1) **The major political party whose candidate received the
 16 highest number of votes in the county for secretary of state
 17 at the last election is listed first.**

18 (2) **The major political party whose candidate received the
 19 second highest number of votes in the county for secretary of
 20 state is listed second.**

21 (3) **All other political parties listed in the order that the
 22 parties' candidates for secretary of state finished in the last
 23 election are listed after the party listed in subdivision (2).**

24 (4) **If a political party did not have a candidate for secretary
 25 of state in the last election or a nominee is an independent
 26 candidate, the party or candidate is listed after the parties
 27 described in subdivisions (1), (2), and (3).**

28 (5) **If more than one (1) political party or independent
 29 candidate qualifies to be on the ballot, the parties,
 30 candidates, or tickets are listed in the order in which the
 31 party filed its petition of nomination under IC 3-8-6-12.**

32 (6) **The name of a candidate described in
 33 IC 3-8-2.5-2.5(a)(5)(C) is placed after the candidates listed in
 34 subdivisions (1) through (5), if applicable.**

35 (7) **A space for write-in voting is placed after the candidates
 36 listed in subdivisions (1) through (6), if required by law.**

37 (8) **The name of a write-in candidate may not be listed on the
 38 ballot.**

39 **If there is more than one (1) candidate for a grouping described in
 40 subdivisions (1) through (8) for a school board office, the
 41 candidates shall appear in the order established by this subsection
 42 and within the grouping, in alphabetical order according to
 43 surname.**

44 SECTION 2. IC 3-11-13-11, AS AMENDED BY THE
 45 TECHNICAL CORRECTIONS BILL OF THE 2026 GENERAL
 46 ASSEMBLY, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
 47 UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 11. (a) The ballot information, whether placed
 48 on the ballot card or on the marking device, must be in the order of
 49 arrangement provided for ballots under this section.

50 (b) Each county election board shall have the names of all

1 candidates for all elected offices, political party offices, and public
2 questions printed on a ballot card as provided in this chapter. The
3 county may:

4 (1) print all offices and questions on a single ballot card; and
5 (2) include a ballot variation code to ensure that the proper
6 version of a ballot is used within a precinct.

7 (c) Each type of ballot card must be of uniform size and of the
8 same quality and color of paper (except as permitted under
9 IC 3-10-1-17).

10 (d) The nominees of a political party or an independent candidate
11 or independent ticket (described in IC 3-11-2-6) nominated by
12 petitioners shall be listed on the ballot with the name and device set
13 forth on the certification or petition. The circle containing the device
14 may be of any size that permits a voter to readily identify the device.
15 IC 3-11-2-5 applies if the certification or petition does not include a
16 name or device, or if the same device is selected by two (2) or more
17 parties or petitioners. In the case of a candidate described in
18 IC 3-8-2.5-2.5(a)(5)(C), a blank space **must be printed** after the
19 candidate's name signifying that the candidate elects not to disclose any
20 affiliation with a political party or that the candidate:

21 (1) is not affiliated with a political party; and
22 (2) does not identify as an independent candidate.

23 (e) The offices and public questions on the general election ballot
24 must be placed on the ballot in the order listed in IC 3-11-2-12,
25 IC 3-11-2-12.4, IC 3-11-2-12.5, IC 3-11-2-12.7(b), IC 3-11-2-12.9(a),
26 IC 3-11-2-12.9(c), IC 3-11-2-13(a) through IC 3-11-2-13(c),
27 IC 3-11-2-14(a), IC 3-11-2-14(d), and IC 3-11-2-14(e). The offices and
28 public questions may be listed in a continuous column either vertically
29 or horizontally and on a number of separate pages.

30 (f) The name of each office must be printed in a uniform size in
31 bold type. A statement reading substantially as follows must be placed
32 immediately below the name of the office and above the name of the
33 first candidate:

34 (1) "Vote for one (1) only.", if only one (1) candidate is to be
35 elected to the office.

36 (2) "Vote for not more than (insert the number of candidates to
37 be elected) candidate(s) for this office. To vote for any candidate
38 for this office, you must make a voting mark for each candidate
39 you wish to vote for. A straight party vote will not count as a
40 vote for any candidate for this office.", if more than one (1)
41 candidate is to be elected to the office.

42 (3) "Vote for one (1) only. A straight party vote will not count as
43 a vote for any candidate for this office.", if only one (1)
44 candidate is to be elected to a school board office.

45 (g) Below the name of the office and the statement required by
46 subsection (f), the names of the candidates for each office must be
47 grouped together in the following order:

48 (1) The major political party whose candidate received the
49 highest number of votes in the county for secretary of state at the
50 last election is listed first.

1 (2) The major political party whose candidate received the
2 second highest number of votes in the county for secretary of
3 state is listed second.
4 (3) All other political parties listed in the order that the parties'
5 candidates for secretary of state finished in the last election are
6 listed after the party listed in subdivision (2).
7 (4) If a political party did not have a candidate for secretary of
8 state in the last election or a nominee is an independent
9 candidate or independent ticket (described in IC 3-11-2-6), the
10 party or candidate is listed after the parties described in
11 subdivisions (1), (2), and (3).
12 (5) If more than one (1) political party or independent candidate
13 or ticket described in subdivision (4) qualifies to be on the
14 ballot, the parties, candidates, or tickets are listed in the order in
15 which the party filed its petition of nomination under
16 IC 3-8-6-12.
17 (6) The name of a candidate described in IC 3-8-2.5-2.5(a)(5)(C)
18 is placed after the candidates listed in subdivisions (1) through
19 (5), if applicable.
20 (7) A space for write-in voting is placed after the candidates
21 listed in subdivisions (1) through (6), if required by law.
22 (8) The name of a write-in candidate may not be listed on the
23 ballot.

If there is more than one (1) candidate for a grouping described in subdivisions (1) through (8) for a school board office, the candidates shall appear in the order established by this subsection and within the grouping, in alphabetical order according to surname.

29 (h) The names of the candidates grouped in the order established
30 by subsection (g) must be printed in type with uniform capital letters
31 and have a uniform space between each name. The name of the
32 candidate's political party, or the word "Independent" if the:

33 (1) candidate; or
34 (2) ticket of candidates for:

35 (A) President and Vice President of the United States; or
36 (B) governor and lieutenant governor;
37 is independent, must be placed immediately below or beside the name
38 of the candidate and must be printed in a uniform size and type. In the
39 case of a candidate described in IC 3-8-2.5-2.5(a)(5)(C), the name of
40 the candidate must be printed with a blank space after the candidate's
41 name signifying that the candidate elects not to disclose any affiliation
42 with a political party or that the candidate is not affiliated with a
43 political party and does not identify as an independent candidate.

44 (i) All the candidates of the same political party for election to
45 at-large seats on the fiscal or legislative body of a political subdivision
46 must be grouped together:

47 (1) under the name of the office that the candidates are seeking;
48 (2) in the order established by subsection (g); and
49 (3) within the political party, in alphabetical order according to
50 surname.

1 A statement reading substantially as follows must be placed
2 immediately below the name of the office and above the name of the
3 first candidate: "Vote for not more than (insert the number of
4 candidates to be elected) candidate(s) of ANY party for this office.".

5 (j) Candidates for election to at-large seats on the governing body
6 of a school corporation must be grouped:

7 (1) under the name of the office that the candidates are seeking;
8 and

9 (2) in alphabetical order according to surname.

10 A statement reading substantially as follows must be placed
11 immediately below the name of the office and above the name of the
12 first candidate: "Vote for not more than (insert the number of
13 candidates to be elected) candidate(s) for this office. A straight party
14 vote will not count as a vote for any candidate for this office.".

15 (k) The following information must be placed at the top of the
16 ballot before the first public question is listed:

17 (1) The cautionary statement described in IC 3-11-2-7.

18 (2) The instructions described in IC 3-11-2-8, IC 3-11-2-10(d),
19 and IC 3-11-2-10(e).

20 (l) The ballot must include a single connectable arrow, circle, oval,
21 or square, or a voting position for voting a straight party ticket by one
22 (1) mark as required by section 14 of this chapter, and the single
23 connectable arrow, circle, oval, or square, or the voting position for
24 casting a straight party ticket ballot must be identified by:

25 (1) the name of the political party; and

26 (2) immediately below or beside the political party's name, the
27 device of that party (described in IC 3-11-2-5).

28 The name and device of each political party must be of uniform size
29 and type and arranged in the order established by subsection (g) for
30 listing candidates under each office. The instructions described in
31 IC 3-11-2-10(c) for voting a straight party ticket and the statement
32 concerning presidential electors required under IC 3-10-4-3 must be
33 placed on the ballot label. The instructions for voting a straight party
34 ticket must include the statement: "If you do not wish to vote a straight
35 party ticket, do not make a mark in this section and proceed to voting
36 the ballot by office.".

37 (m) A public question must be in the form described in
38 IC 3-11-2-15(a) and IC 3-11-2-15(b), except that a single connectable
39 arrow, a circle, or an oval may be used instead of a square. Except as
40 expressly authorized or required by statute, a county election board
41 may not print a ballot card that contains language concerning the public
42 question other than the language authorized by a statute.

43 (n) The requirements in this section:

44 (1) do not replace; and

45 (2) are in addition to;

46 any other requirements in this title that apply to optical scan ballots.

47 (o) The procedure described in IC 3-11-2-16 must be used when
48 a ballot does not comply with the requirements imposed by this title or
49 contains another error or omission that might result in confusion or
50 mistakes by voters.

(p) This subsection applies to an optical scan ballot that does not list:

- (1) the names of political parties or candidates; or
- (2) the text of public questions;

on the face of the ballot. The ballot must be prepared in accordance with this section, except that the ballot must include a numbered circle or oval to refer to each political party, candidate, or public question.

SECTION 3. IC 3-11-14-3.5, AS AMENDED BY THE TECHNICAL CORRECTIONS BILL OF THE 2026 GENERAL ASSEMBLY, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 3.5. (a) Each county election board shall have the names of all candidates for all elected offices, political party offices, and public questions printed on ballot labels for use in an electronic voting system as provided in this chapter.

(b) The county may:

- (1) print all offices and public questions on a single ballot label; and
- (2) include a ballot variation code to ensure that the proper version of a ballot label is used within a precinct.

(c) Each type of ballot label must be of uniform size and of the same quality and color of paper (except as permitted under IC 3-10-1-17).

(d) The nominees of a political party or an independent candidate or independent ticket (described in IC 3-11-2-6) nominated by petitioners must be listed on the ballot label with the name and device set forth on the certification or petition. The circle containing the device may be of any size that permits a voter to readily identify the device. IC 3-11-2-5 applies if the certification or petition does not include a name or device, or if the same device is selected by two (2) or more parties or petitioners. In the case of a candidate described in IC 3-8-2.5-2.5(a)(5)(C), a blank space **must be printed** after the candidate's name signifying that the candidate elects not to disclose any affiliation with a political party or that the candidate:

- (1) is not affiliated with a political party; and
- (2) does not identify as an independent candidate.

(e) The ballot labels must list the offices and public questions on the general election ballot in the order listed in IC 3-11-2-12, IC 3-11-2-12.4, IC 3-11-2-12.5, IC 3-11-2-12.7(b), IC 3-11-2-12.9(a), IC 3-11-2-12.9(c), IC 3-11-2-13(a) through IC 3-11-2-13(c), IC 3-11-2-14(a), IC 3-11-2-14(d), and IC 3-11-2-14(e). Each office and public question may have a separate screen, or the offices and public questions may be listed in a continuous column either vertically or horizontally.

(f) The name of each office must be printed in a uniform size in bold type. A statement reading substantially as follows must be placed immediately below the name of the office and above the name of the first candidate:

(1) "Vote for one (1) only.", if only one (1) candidate is to be elected to the office.

(2) "Vote for not more than (insert the number of candidates to

1 be elected) candidate(s) for this office. To vote for any candidate
2 for this office, you must make a voting mark for each candidate
3 you wish to vote for. A straight party vote will not count as a
4 vote for any candidate for this office.", if more than one (1)
5 candidate is to be elected to the office.

6 (3) "Vote for one (1) only. A straight party vote will not count as
7 a vote for any candidate for this office.", if only one (1)
8 candidate is to be elected to a school board office.

9 (g) Below the name of the office and the statement required by
10 subsection (f), the names of the candidates for each office must be
11 grouped together in the following order:

12 (1) The major political party whose candidate received the
13 highest number of votes in the county for secretary of state at the
14 last election is listed first.

15 (2) The major political party whose candidate received the
16 second highest number of votes in the county for secretary of
17 state is listed second.

18 (3) All other political parties listed in the order that the parties'
19 candidates for secretary of state finished in the last election are
20 listed after the party listed in subdivision (2).

21 (4) If a political party did not have a candidate for secretary of
22 state in the last election or a nominee is an independent
23 candidate or independent ticket (described in IC 3-11-2-6), the
24 party or candidate is listed after the parties described in
25 subdivisions (1), (2), and (3).

26 (5) If more than one (1) political party or independent candidate
27 or ticket described in subdivision (4) qualifies to be on the
28 ballot, the parties, candidates, or tickets are listed in the order in
29 which the party filed its petition of nomination under
30 IC 3-8-6-12.

31 (6) The name of a candidate described in IC 3-8-2.5-2.5(a)(5)(C)
32 is placed after the candidates listed in subdivisions (1) through
33 (5), if applicable.

34 (7) A space for write-in voting is placed after the candidates
35 listed in subdivisions (1) through (6), if required by law. A space
36 for write-in voting for an office is not required if there are no
37 declared write-in candidates for that office. However, procedures
38 must be implemented to permit write-in voting for candidates for
39 federal offices.

40 (8) The name of a write-in candidate may not be listed on the
41 ballot.

42 **If there is more than one (1) candidate for a grouping described in
43 subsections (1) through (8) for a school board office, the
44 candidates shall appear in the order established by this subsection
45 and within the grouping, in alphabetical order according to
46 surname.**

47 (h) The names of the candidates grouped in the order established
48 by subsection (g) must be printed in type with uniform capital letters
49 and have a uniform space between each name. The name of the
50 candidate's political party, or the word "Independent", if the:

(1) candidate; or
(2) ticket of candidates for:
 (A) President and Vice President of the United States; or
 (B) governor and lieutenant governor;

is independent, must be placed immediately below or beside the name of the candidate and must be printed in uniform size and type. In the case of a candidate described in IC 3-8-2.5-2.5(a)(5)(C), the name of the candidate must be printed with a blank space after the candidate's name signifying that the candidate elects not to disclose any affiliation with a political party or that the candidate is not affiliated with a political party and does not identify as an independent candidate.

(i) All the candidates of the same political party for election to at-large seats on the fiscal or legislative body of a political subdivision must be grouped together:
 (1) under the name of the office that the candidates are seeking;
 (2) in the party order established by subsection (g); and
 (3) within the political party, in alphabetical order according to surname.

A statement reading substantially as follows must be placed immediately below the name of the office and above the name of the first candidate: "Vote for not more than (insert the number of candidates to be elected) candidate(s) of ANY party for this office.".

(j) Candidates for election to at-large seats on the governing body of a school corporation must be grouped:
 (1) under the name of the office that the candidates are seeking; and
 (2) in alphabetical order according to surname.

A statement reading substantially as follows must be placed immediately below the name of the office and above the name of the first candidate: "Vote for not more than (insert the number of candidates to be elected) candidate(s) for this office. A straight party vote will not count as a vote for any candidate for this office.".

(k) The cautionary statement described in IC 3-11-2-7 must be placed at the top or beginning of the ballot label before the first public question is listed.
 (l) The instructions described in IC 3-11-2-8, IC 3-11-2-10(d), and IC 3-11-2-10(e) may be:
 (1) placed on the ballot label; or
 (2) posted in a location within the voting booth that permits the voter to easily read the instructions.

(m) Except as provided in section 14.5 of this chapter, the ballot label must include a touch sensitive point or button for voting a straight political party ticket by one (1) touch, and the touch sensitive point or button must be identified by:
 (1) the name of the political party; and
 (2) immediately below or beside the political party's name, the device of that party (described in IC 3-11-2-5).

The name and device of each party must be of uniform size and type, and arranged in the order established by subsection (g) for listing candidates under each office. The instructions described in

1 IC 3-11-2-10(c) for voting a straight party ticket and the statement
2 concerning presidential electors required under IC 3-10-4-3 must be
3 placed on the ballot label. The instructions for voting a straight party
4 ticket must include the statement: "If you do not wish to vote a straight
5 party ticket, press "NEXT" (or replace "NEXT" with the term used by
6 that voting system to permit a voter to skip a ballot screen) to continue
7 voting.".

8 (n) A public question must be in the form described in
9 IC 3-11-2-15(a) and IC 3-11-2-15(b), except that a touch sensitive
10 point or button must be used instead of a square. Except as expressly
11 authorized or required by statute, a county election board may not print
12 a ballot label that contains language concerning the public question
13 other than the language authorized by a statute.

14 (o) The requirements in this section:
15 (1) do not replace; and
16 (2) are in addition to;

17 any other requirements in this title that apply to ballots for electronic
18 voting systems.

19 (p) The procedure described in IC 3-11-2-16 must be used when
20 a ballot label does not comply with the requirements imposed by this
21 title or contains another error or omission that might result in confusion
22 or mistakes by voters.

23 **SECTION 4. An emergency is declared for this act.**
