## SENATE BILL No. 52

### DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 31-17-5.

**Synopsis:** Grandparent visitation. Provides that a grandparent who has had a demonstrable history of meaningful contact with a child may seek visitation rights. Allows a parent, guardian, or custodian to submit a confidential statement regarding the parent's, guardian's, or custodian's concerns about a grandparent's visitation. Requires the court to review a confidential statement submitted in camera and seal the record to protect the parties' privacy. Requires a petition for custody to include certain information. Makes conforming changes.

Effective: July 1, 2026.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning family law and juvenile law.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

34	(b) A petition described in subsection (a) must be filed prior to the
