DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 35-31.5-2; IC 35-45-1.

Synopsis: Masks at public assemblies. Makes wearing a mask at a public assembly a Class C misdemeanor, and increases the penalty to a Class A misdemeanor for a second or subsequent offense. Provides a defense under certain circumstances. Increases the penalty for rioting and disorderly conduct to a Level 6 felony if the offense is committed while wearing a mask.

Effective: July 1, 2026.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning criminal law and procedure.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

2	(4) A covering worn for the purposes of occupational safety.

7	operating or riding on a motorcycle, bicycle, scooter, roller

16	(c) "Public assembly" means a gathering:
17	(1) of at least ten (10) persons; and
18	(2) that occurs in a public place or in a place to which the
19	general public is invited or permitted to enter.
20	(d) "Tumultuous conduct" means conduct that results in, or is likely
21	to result in, serious bodily injury to a person or substantial damage to
22	property.
23	(e) "Unlawful assembly" means an assembly of five (5) or more
24	persons whose common object is to commit an unlawful act, or a lawful
25	act by unlawful means. Prior concert is not necessary to form an
26	unlawful assembly.
27	SECTION 4. IC 35-45-1-2, AS AMENDED BY P.L.94-2021,
28	SECTION 3, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
29	JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 2. A person who, being a member of an unlawful
30	assembly, recklessly, knowingly, or intentionally engages in
31	tumultuous conduct commits rioting, a Class A misdemeanor.
32	However, the offense is:
33	(1) a Level 6 felony if it:
34	(A) is committed while armed with a deadly weapon;
35	(B) results in serious bodily injury; or
36	(C) causes property damage of at least seven hundred fifty
37	dollars (\$750) and less than fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000);

4	[EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 3. (a) A person who recklessly
5	knowingly, or intentionally:
6	(1) engages in fighting or in tumultuous conduct;
7	(2) makes unreasonable noise and continues to do so after being
8	asked to stop; or
9	(3) disrupts a lawful assembly of persons;
0	commits disorderly conduct, a Class B misdemeanor.

32	person's identity, wears a mask while present at a public assembly
33	commits unlawful masking, a Class C misdemeanor. However, the
34	offense is a Class A misdemeanor if the person has a prior
35	unrelated conviction under this section.
36	(b) It is a defense to a prosecution under this section that the:
37	(1) public assembly takes place on private property;
38	(2) public assembly is held with the permission of the owner

permission to participants in the public assembly to wear masks.
