Proposed Changes to introduced printing by AM007803

DIGEST OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Wireless communication device policy. Removes a provision concerning the return of wireless communication devices upon a student's dismissal at the end of the school day. Provides that a wireless communication device policy implemented by each school corporation and charter school may not prohibit a student from using a wireless communication device during the school day if the use of the device is necessary for the management of a documented medical condition pursuant to an order provided by a health care provider who is licensed in Indiana.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 20-26-5-40.7, AS ADDED BY P.L.24-2024,
2 SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3 JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 40.7. (a) As used in this section, "instructional
4 time" has the meaning set forth in IC 20-30-2-1. "school day" means
5 the entirety of the time a student is present on school property for
6 a student instructional day (as defined in IC 20-30-2-2).
7 (b) As used in this section, "wireless communication device"
8 means any portable wireless device that has the capability to provide
9 voice, messaging, or other data communication between two (2) or
10 more parties, including a:
11 (1) cellular telephone;
12 (2) tablet computer;
13 (3) laptop computer; or
14 (4) gaming device; or
15 (5) smartwatch that is connected to a cellular telephone, a
16 cell tower, or the Internet.
