A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning health.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 16-41-7.5-14, AS AMENDED BY P.L.130-2021,
- 2 SECTION 15, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
- 3 UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 14. This chapter expires July 1, ~~2026~~ **2036**.
- 4 SECTION 2. **An emergency is declared for this act.**
