**Summary of Legislation:** The bill extends the period within which certain election material must be preserved from 22 months to 60 months.

**Explanation of Local Expenditures:** The provision would increase from 1 year and 10 months to 5 years the time length that election materials including paper ballots would be have to be preserved after an election. Certain county election boards may need additional storage space to keep all paper ballots properly and securely preserved. Any increase to county expenditures would depend on the vacancy levels of existing storage space currently used for election materials and the cost of rental for additional storage, if all county owned storage space is at capacity.
