



SENATE MOTION

MR. PRESIDENT:

I move that Senate Bill 140 be amended to read as follows:

1 Page 1, line 5, delete "7" and insert "**5**".
2 Page 1, line 7, delete "targeted person"" and insert "**individual**"'.
3 Page 1, delete lines 9 through 17, begin a new line block indented
4 and insert:
5 **"(1) The individual's spouse.**
6 **(2) The individual's child, including a stepchild.**
7 **(3) The individual's parent or stepparent.**
8 **(4) The individual's sibling.**
9 **(5) The individual's grandparent.**
10 **(6) A person living in the same household as the individual.**
11 **(7) A person involved in a dating relationship with the**
12 **individual."**.
13 Page 2, line 22, delete "platform, electronic mail, or" and insert
14 **"platform."**.
15 Page 2, delete line 23.
16 Page 2, delete lines 33 through 42, begin a new paragraph and
17 insert:
18 **"Sec. 6. (a) Except as provided in section 7 or 8 of this chapter,**
19 **a person who, with the intent of harming an individual, posts the**
20 **personal information of:**
21 **(1) the individual; or**
22 **(2) a person closely connected to the individual;**
23 **on a social media platform commits doxxing, a Class A**
24 **misdemeanor, except as provided in subsection (b).**
25 **(b) The offense described in subsection (a) is a:**
26 **(1) Level 6 felony if the posting of the personal information**
27 **results in the individual suffering serious bodily injury; and**

(2) Level 5 felony if the posting of the personal information results in the individual suffering catastrophic injury or death.".

Delete page 3, begin a new paragraph, and insert:

"Sec. 7. The following are not prohibited by this chapter:

(1) Providing an individual's personal information to:

(A) a local, state, or federal law enforcement agency;

(B) the department of child services; or

(C) a prosecuting attorney, a United States attorney, or the attorney general;

in reporting activity that the person making the report reasonably and in good faith believes may be a crime under state or federal law.

(2) Disseminating an individual's personal information in publicizing or alleging that the individual has engaged in conduct that the person making the report reasonably and in good faith believes is unlawful.

(3) Providing an individual's personal information while engaging in lawful and constitutionally protected activity as it pertains to speech, assembly, and petition.

Sec. 8. This chapter may not be construed to prevent, prohibit, limit, or restrict the freedom of expression protected by the Constitution of the State of Indiana or the Constitution of the United States.".
