## **SENATE BILL No. 148**

## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 36-8-25.5.

**Synopsis:** Indiana crime guns task force. Adds LaPorte County and Porter County to the task force area of the Indiana crime guns task force (task force). Increases the number of members of the executive board of the task force required for a quorum and to take official action in the event of a tie vote.

Effective: July 1, 2026.

## SENATE BILL No. 148

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning local government.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 36-8-25.5-1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.16-2025
SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 1. The following definitions apply throughout this
chapter:
(1) "Executive board" means the task force executive board
established by section 3 of this chapter.
(2) "Task force" means the Indiana crime guns task force
established by section 2 of this chapter.
(3) "Task force area" means one (1) or more of the following
counties:
(A) Boone County.
(B) Hamilton County.
(C) Hancock County.
(D) Hendricks County.
(E) Marion County.
(F) Morgan County.
(G) Johnson County.

9	established to oversee and direct the operations of the task force.
10	(b) The executive board consists of:
11	(1) the chief of police of the Indianapolis metropolitan police
12	department or the chief's designee, who serves as the chairperson
13	of the executive board;
14	(2) the superintendent of the Indiana state police department or
15	the superintendent's designee, who serves as the vice chairperson
16	of the executive board; and
17	(3) a sheriff or chief of police from each department in the task
18	force area which has assigned an officer to the task force.
19	(c) The executive board shall hold meetings at the call of the
20	chairperson. The executive board may establish rules governing
21	meetings.
22	(d) Seven (7) Eight (8) executive board members constitute a
23	quorum for the transaction of business. Each member has one (1) vote,
24	and action by the executive board may be taken only upon the
25	affirmative votes of the majority of attending members. If a vote is a
26	tie, the position for which the chairperson voted prevails, as long as
27	that position has received the affirmative votes of at least four (4) five
28	(5) members.
29	(e) A member of the executive board is not entitled to:
30	(1) the minimum salary per diem provided by IC 4-10-11-2.1(b):
31	or
32	(2) reimbursement for traveling and other expenses as provided
33	under IC 4-13-1-4.
