<u>Summary of Legislation:</u> This bill adds LaPorte County and Porter County to the task force area of the Indiana Crime Guns Task Force (task force). It increases the number of members of the executive board of the task force required for a quorum and to take official action in the event of a tie vote.

Effective Date: July 1, 2026.

Explanation of State Expenditures: Expanding the Indiana Crime Guns Task Force to LaPorte County and Porter County could increase expenditures and workload for the Indiana Crime Guns Task Force if LaPorte County and Porter County law enforcement agencies participate in the Task Force. The Task Force is funded through the Indiana Crime Guns Task Force Fund, which is administered through the Indiana Criminal Justice Institute. Expenditure increases would come from the additional staffing, training, and equipment needed to cover the additional county. The bill is silent on the funding for adding the additional counties. Current funds would need to be redistributed to cover LaPorte County and Porter County if they decide to participate in the Task Force. The Task Force received General Fund appropriations of \$2 M for FY 2026.

Explanation of State Revenues: If LaPorte County and Porter County law enforcement agencies participate in the Indiana Crime Guns Task Force, the Memorandum of Understanding required by the Task Force may require the law enforcement agencies to contribute money to the Indiana Crime Guns Task Force Fund.

<u>Explanation of Local Expenditures:</u> <u>Summary</u> - This bill could increase expenditures and workload for law enforcement agencies within LaPorte County and Porter County if the law enforcement agencies within LaPorte County and Porter County participate in the Indiana Crime Guns Task Force.

<u>Additional Information</u> - Under current law, Indiana Crime Guns Task Force addresses violent crime in Allen, Boone, Hamilton, Hancock, Hendricks, Marion, Morgan, Johnson, and Shelby counties by delivering, in cooperation with state and federal officials, a uniform strategy to trace firearms used to commit crimes. HEA 1095–2025 added Lake County to the list of areas that may participate in the Indiana Crime Guns Task Force.
