Proposed Changes to introduced printing by AM014802

DIGEST OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT

Fund. Specifies that no expenditure from the Indiana crime guns task force may be made to or on behalf of Porter County or LaPorte County before July 1, 2027.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning local government.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

SECTION 1. IC 36-8-25.5-1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.16-2025, SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 1. The following definitions apply throughout this chapter:

- (1) "Executive board" means the task force executive board established by section 3 of this chapter.
- (2) "Task force" means the Indiana crime guns task force established by section 2 of this chapter.
- (3) "Task force area" means one (1) or more of the following counties:
 - (A) Boone County.
 - (B) Hamilton County.
 - (C) Hancock County.
 - (D) Hendricks County.
 - (E) Marion County.
 - (F) Morgan County.
 - (G) Johnson County.
 - (H) Shelby County.
 - (I) Allen County.
 - (J) Lake County.

SECTION 2. IC 36-8-25.5-3, AS AMENDED BY P.L.16-2025, SECTION 2, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 3. (a) The task force executive board is established to oversee and direct the operations of the task force.

(b) The executive board consists of:

(1) the chief of police of the Indianapolis metropolitan police department or the chief's designee, who serves as the chairperson of the executive board;

(2) the superintendent of the Indiana state police department or the superintendent's designee, who serves as the vice chairperson of the executive board; and

(3) a sheriff or chief of police from each department in the task force area which has assigned an officer to the task force.

(c) The executive board shall hold meetings at the call of the chairperson. The executive board may establish rules governing meetings.

(d) ~~Seven (7)~~ **Eight (8)** executive board members constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Each member has one (1) vote, and action by the executive board may be taken only upon the affirmative votes of the majority of attending members. If a vote is a tie, the position for which the chairperson voted prevails, as long as that position has received the affirmative votes of at least ~~four (4)~~ **five (5)** members.

(e) A member of the executive board is not entitled to:

(1) the minimum salary per diem provided by IC 4-10-11-2.1(b);

or

(2) reimbursement for traveling and other expenses as provided under IC 4-13-1-4. [

SECTION 3. IC 36-8-25.5-8, AS AMENDED BY P.L.201-2023, SECTION 281, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 8. (a) The Indiana criminal justice institute shall establish the Indiana crime guns task force fund for the purpose of providing support for the operations of the task force.

(b) The fund consists of the following:

(1) Grants and donations made to the task force.

(2) Money from participating agencies in accordance with the memorandum of understanding.

(3) Money appropriated to fund the task force.

(c) The expenses of the task force shall be paid by the fund.

(d) The Indiana criminal justice institute shall administer the fund.



1 (e) The Indiana criminal justice institute shall process all
2 expenditures and claims for payment made by the executive board.
3 Expenditures from the fund shall not exceed the available balance of
4 the fund.

5 (f) The Indiana criminal justice institute shall use all money in the
6 fund to support the operations of the task force.

7 (g) The Indiana criminal justice institute may not transfer, assign,
8 or otherwise remove money from the Indiana crime guns task force
9 fund for any purpose outside of the mission of the task force as
10 determined by the executive board of the task force.

11 (h) Money in the fund at the end of a state fiscal year does not
12 revert to the state general fund.

13 **(i) Before July 1, 2027, no expenditure may be made from the**
14 **fund to or on behalf of Porter County or LaPorte County, whether**
15 **for purposes of reimbursement or otherwise. This subsection**
16 **expires December 31, 2027.**
