Summary of Legislation: The bill makes it an aggravating circumstance for purposes of sentencing that the person: (1) committed a sex offense; and (2) used an online platform designed for dating to meet the victim.

Effective Date: July 1, 2026.

<u>Explanation of State Expenditures:</u> Expenditures could increase if people who have been convicted of a sex offense receive longer sentences in the Department of Correction (DOC). The impact is indeterminate and will depend on the number of people convicted of a sex offense who used an online dating platform to meet the victim, and the extent to which judicial officers take this aggravating circumstance into consideration for sentencing.

A court is required to state the reasons for selecting a sentence being imposed, unless the court imposes the advisory sentence. The following are the advisory and maximum sentence for all felony levels. About 60% of cases with a sex offense, as the highest convicted charge, are committed to the DOC (about 790 of the 1,300 annual convictions). The incremental cost to house an adult offender is \$4,825 annually (or \$13.22 daily) per prisoner for medical care, food, and clothing. The incremental cost for juvenile facilities was \$8,986 annually (or \$24.62 daily).

sexual misconduct with a minor (as a Level 1 - Level 5 felony); kidnapping or criminal confinement (not by a parent or guardian); incest; possession of child sex abuse material; promotion of sexual trafficking; sexual misconduct by a service provider with a detained or supervised child; and molesting, exploitation, sexual trafficking, solicitation, or seduction of a child.

Many of these are also offenses listed under the definition of "crime of violence," which already preclude them from statutory caps on the length of consecutive terms of sentences a person may serve when more than one offense was committed in a single episode. Additionally, a couple of these offenses make a person a credit restricted felon, which reduces the amount of credit time available.

Explanation of State Revenues:

Explanation of Local Expenditures: If sentences are lengthened due to the new aggravating circumstance, post-trial time in jail for Level 6 felonies could increase. The length of time served for those in community corrections programs (for any felony level) could also increase. Even the portions of a sentence that are suspended are typically done so under probation, which could lengthen the time for probation supervision. The Gateway reports show that in CY 2023, housing offenders in 33 Indiana county jails cost an average of \$56 to \$79 per day, while the average cost for community corrections supervision is \$10.96 per day and for probation supervision is \$3.39 per day.
