SENATE BILL No. 159

DIGEST OF SB 159 (Updated January 22, 2026 3:05 pm - DI 143)

Citations Affected: IC 20-20; IC 20-26.

Synopsis: School technology plans and policies. Requires school corporations and charter schools (schools) to include in the school's technology plan a description of the school's plan to: (1) ensure the appropriate use of technological devices in schools; and (2) enable parents of students to exercise control over a student's technological devices while the student is not in school or engaged in virtual instruction or remote learning. Not later than January 1, 2027, requires a school to include in the school's Internet use policy a provision that enables the parent of a student to increase the strength of certain filters, block access to websites or content, and limit the use of certain devices. Creates an exemption from the Internet use policy requirement. Requires a school to include in the school's wireless communication device policy a provision that prohibits a student from using school supplied technological devices for a noneducational purpose during instructional time.

Effective: July 1, 2026.

SENATE BILL No. 159

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 20-20-13-7, AS AMENDED BY P.L.189-2023,
2 SECTION 2, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3 JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 7. (a) Notwithstanding any other law, a:
4 (1) school corporation may not:
5 (A) receive any money under this chapter;
6 (B) use money from the school corporation's education fund
7 for educational technology equipment under IC 20-40-2; or
8 (C) receive an advance from the common school fund for an
9 educational technology program under IC 20-49-4; and
10 (2) charter school may not receive:
11 (A) a technology plan grant under sections 13 through 24 of
12 this chapter; or
13 (B) an advance from the common school fund for an
14 educational technology program under IC 20-49-4;
15 unless the school corporation or charter school develops a three (3)
16 year technology plan.
17 (b) Each technology plan must include at least the following

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1 information:

2 (1) A description of the school corporation's or charter school's
3 intent to integrate technology into the school corporation's or
4 charter school's curriculum.
5 (2) A plan for providing inservice training.
6 (3) A schedule for maintaining and replacing educational
7 technology equipment.
8 (4) A description of the criteria used to select the appropriate
9 educational technology equipment for the appropriate use.

10 **(5) A description of the school corporation's or charter
11 school's plan to:**

12 (A) ensure the appropriate use of technological devices in
13 schools; and

14 (B) enable parents of students to exercise control over a
15 student's technological devices as described in

26 ASSEMBLY, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
27 JULY 1, 2026]: Sec. 40.5. (a) ~~Not later than January 1, 2022~~, Each
28 school corporation and charter school shall adopt and implement an
29 Internet use policy that:

30 (1) prohibits the sending, receiving, viewing, or downloading of
31 materials that are harmful to minors (as described in
32 IC 35-49-2-2) on computers and other technology related devices
33 owned by the school corporation or charter school;

34 (2) provides for the use of hardware or installation of software on
35 computers and other technology related devices described in
36 subdivision (1) to filter or block Internet access to materials that
37 are harmful to minors; and

38 (3) establishes appropriate disciplinary measures to be taken
39 against persons violating the policy established under this section.

41 charter school shall use hardware or install software on computers and

30 time" has the meaning set forth in IC 20-30-2-1.

31 (b) As used in this section, "wireless communication device" means

32 any portable wireless device that has the capability to provide voice,

33 messaging, or other data communication between two (2) or more

34 parties, including a:

35 (1) cellular telephone;

36 (2) tablet computer;

37 (3) laptop computer; or

38 (4) gaming device.

39 (c) Each school corporation and charter school shall adopt and

40 implement a wireless communication device policy that:

41 (1) except as provided in subdivisions (2) and (3) and subsection

42 (d), prohibits a student from using a:

Mr. President: The Senate Committee on Education and Career Development, to which was referred Senate Bill No. 159, has had the same under consideration and begs leave to report the same back to the Senate with the recommendation that said bill be AMENDED as follows:

Page 3, between lines 2 and 3, begin a new line block indented and insert:

- "(1) increase the strength of the filter described in subsection (b);**
- (2) block access to websites or content accessible on a device described in subsection (a)(1); and**
- (3) limit the amount of time a device described in subsection (a)(1) may be used by the student while the student is not in school."**

Page 3, delete lines 3 through 7.

and when so amended that said bill do pass.

SENATE MOTION

Mr. President: I move that Senate Bill 159 be amended to read as follows:

Page 2, delete lines 14 through 16, begin a new line double block indented and insert:

"(B) enable parents of students to exercise control over a student's technological devices as described in IC 20-26-5-40.5(c) while the student is not:

- (i) in school; or**
- (ii) engaged in virtual instruction or remote learning."**

Page 2, line 42, delete "Not" and insert **"Except as provided in subsection (e), not"**.

Page 3, delete lines 7 through 9, begin a new line block indented and insert:

"(3) limit the amount of time a device described in subsection



(a)(1) may be used by the student;".

Page 3, line 10, delete "A" and insert "**while the student is not in school or engaged in virtual instruction or remote learning. A**".

Page 3, between lines 15 and 16, begin a new paragraph and insert:

"(e) A school to which this section applies that, as of June 30, 2026, has a contract with a vendor that:

(1) provides for the implementation of the requirements of subsection (b); and

(2) cannot provide for the implementation of the requirements of subsection (c);

is exempt from the requirements of subsection (c) until the expiration or renewal of the contract. This subsection expires July 1, 2030."
