**Summary of Legislation:** This bill prohibits a county, city, or town from: (1) adopting or enforcing a planning, zoning, or land use ordinance or regulation; or (2) imposing a condition for a permit or approval; relating to the establishment, use, or maintenance of a shooting range that is more stringent than state law.

**Effective Date:** July 1, 2026.

**Explanation of Local Expenditures:** Counties, cities, and towns with regulations prohibited under this law will have to repeal or alter those regulations. The bill may also cause orders based upon those regulations to be vacated.
