**Summary of Legislation:** This bill requires a landlord to provide notice at least five days before filing an eviction that includes the following:

- (1) The amount owed.
- (2) A calculation of late fees.
- (3) Acceptable methods of payment.
- (4) The date the landlord intends to file an eviction if charges remain unpaid.

The bill provides methods of written notice. It also provides that notice is not required to terminate a lease if the landlord has met other notice requirements. It requires a landlord to complete required repairs issued by an eligible enforcement authority and meet standards required by a county health department. The bill also repeals a provision concerning refusal or neglect to pay rent and corresponding notice requirements.
